Lev. 5:6, "and he shall bring his <u>trespass offering</u> to the LORD for his sin which he has committed, a female from the flock, a lamb or a kid of the goats as a sin offering. So the priest shall make atonement for him concerning his sin.

Lev. 5:7, "If he is not able to bring a lamb, then he shall bring to the LORD, for his trespass which he has committed, two turtledoves or two young pigeons: one as a <u>sin offering</u> and the other as a burnt offering." 1 Pet. 1:19, "but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot." Acts 8:34, "So the eunuch answered Philip and said, 'I ask you, of whom does the prophet say this, of himself or of some other man?'

Acts 8:35, "Then Philip opened his mouth, and beginning at this Scripture, preached Jesus to him." Acts 8:36, "Now as they went down the road, they came to some water. And the eunuch said, 'See, here is water. What hinders me from being baptized?'" Acts 8:37, "Then Philip said, 'If you believe with all your heart, you may.' And he answered and said, 'I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God.'"

This verse is NOT in most manuscripts of the New Testament; it is neither in the critical text nor the Majority Text.

Only a very few manuscripts, including a few used in the Textus Receptus, contain this verse. It was likely inserted because the text itself gives no specifics on the eunuch's response of faith. Acts 8:39, "Now when they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord caught Philip away, so that the eunuch saw him no more; and he went on his way rejoicing."

harpazo

1) To make off with someone else's property by attacking or seizing—steal, carry off, drag away.

2) To grab or seize suddenly so as to remove or gain control—snatch/take away
