

1. Teach, 19×; διδάσκω *didaskō* "to teach, instruct"

- 2. Encourage, παρακαλέω parakaleō "to urge, exhort, comfort"
- 3. Proclaim καταγγέλλω *kataggellō* "to announce, declare, preach"

4. Declare ἀναγγέλλω anaggellō "to report, announce, recount"

- 5. Proclaim, preach, εὖαγγελίζω euaggelizō "to proclaim good news"
- 6. Strengthen, ἐπιστηρίζω epistērizō "to strengthen, support"
- 7. Preach, κηρύσσω *kērussō* "to proclaim, preach"
- 8. Warn, νουθετέω *noutheteō* "to warn, advise, admonish"
