## The Epistle to the ROMANS



### Rom. 3:9, "What then? Are we better than they? Not at all. For we have previously charged both Jews and Greeks that they are all under sin."

Rom. 3:10, "As it is written: 'There is none righteous, no, not one;

Rom. 3:11, " '<u>There is</u> <u>none who understands;</u> <u>There is none who seeks</u> <u>after God</u>.

Rom. 3:12, "'<u>They have</u> <u>all turned aside: they</u> <u>have together become</u> <u>unprofitable: there is</u> <u>none who does good,</u> <u>no, not one</u>.'" Psa. 14:1, "The fool hath said in his heart, There is no God. They are corrupt, they have done abominable works, there is none that doeth good.

Psa. 14:2, "The LORD looked down from heaven upon the children of men, to see if there were any that did understand, and seek God.

Psa. 14:3, "They are all gone aside, they are all together become filthy: <u>there is none</u> that doeth good, no, not one." Psa. 14:1, "The fool hath said in his heart, There is no God. They are corrupt, they have done abominable works, there is none that doeth good." Psa. 14:2, "The LORD looked down from heaven upon the children of men, to see if there were any that did understand, and seek God."

## Ecclesiastes 7:20, "For there is not a just man on earth who does good and does not sin."

Psalm 15:1, "Lord, who may abide in Your tabernacle? Who may dwell in Your holy hill?

Psalm 15:2, "He who walks uprightly, and works righteousness, and speaks the truth in his heart;

Psalm 15:3, "He who does not backbite with his tongue, nor does evil to his neighbor, nor does he take up a reproach against his friend;"

### Deut. 4:29, "But from there you will seek the LORD your God, and you will find Him if you seek Him with all your heart and with all your soul."

## 1 Chron. 16:11, "Seek the LORD and His strength; seek His face evermore!"

Isa. 55:6, "Seek the LORD while He may be found, call upon Him while He is near.

Isa. 55:7, "Let the wicked forsake his way, and the unrighteous man his thoughts; let him return to the LORD, and He will have mercy on him; and to our God, for He will abundantly pardon."

Jer. 29:12, "Then you will call upon Me and go and pray to Me, and I will listen to you.

Jer. 29:13, "And you will seek Me and find Me, when you search for Me with all your heart." Hos. 5:15, "I will return again to My place till they acknowledge their offense. Then they will seek My face; in their affliction they will earnestly seek Me." Amos 5:4, "For thus says the LORD to the house of Israel: 'Seek Me and live; Amos 5:6, " 'Seek the LORD and live, lest He break out like fire in the house of Joseph, and devour it, with no one to quench it in Bethel—'" Zeph. 2:3, "Seek the LORD, all you meek of the earth, who have upheld His justice. Seek righteousness, seek humility. It may be that you will be hidden in the day of the LORD'S anger." John 6:44, "No one can come to Me unless the Father who sent Me draws him; and I will raise him up at the last day.

John 6:45, "It is written in the prophets, 'And they shall all be taught by God.' Therefore everyone who has heard and learned from the Father comes to Me."

# Isa. 54:13, "All your children shall be taught by the LORD, and great shall be the peace of your children."

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χρηστότης *chrēstotēs* acc fem sing kindness, goodness, combines the ideas of righteousness, mercy, and love. Rom. 2:4, "Or do you despise the riches of His goodness, forbearance, and longsuffering, not knowing that the goodness of God leads you to repentance?"

Psa. 5:9, "For there is no faithfulness in their mouth; their inward part is destruction; <u>their</u> <u>throat is an open</u> <u>tomb; they flatter</u> <u>with their tongue</u>."

### LXX

Psalm 5:9, "For there is no truth in their mouth; their heart is vain;

their throat is an open sepulchre; with their tongues they have used deceit." Rom. 3:13a,

"Their throat is an open tomb; with their tongues they have practiced deceit";

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*Heykal* (הֵיכָל) is also used of the tabernacle (cf. 1 Sam. 1:9; 3:3).

Psa. 140:3,

"They sharpen their tongues like a serpent; <u>the poison</u> <u>of asps is under</u> <u>their lips</u>. Selah." LXX

Psalm 139:3,

"They have sharpened their tongue as the tongue of a serpent; the poison of asps is under their lips. Pause." Rom. 3:13b,

... "The poison of asps is under their lips";

**Psa. 10:7**,

"His <u>mouth is full of</u> <u>cursing and deceit</u> and oppression; under his tongue is trouble and iniquity." LXX

Psa 9:27,

"<u>Whose mouth is full</u> of cursing, and <u>bitterness</u>, and fraud: under his tongue are trouble and pain." Rom. 3:14,

"Whose mouth is full of cursing and bitterness."
