Romans 5:8–12**



Rom. 5:6, “For when we were still without strength, in due time Christ died for the ungodly.”

Adverbial of cause
“Because we have been
reconciled”**

- 1. The human race is in a legal state of hostility toward God because of Adam's sin.**
- 2. No fallen human being can change this state of hostility.**
- 3. The opposite of hostility is peace, harmony.**
- 4. There must be a change of status, the legal penalty must be paid.**
- 5. This payment is through death, the substitutionary spiritual death of Jesus on the cross.**
