Saved from the Presence of Sin 1 Pet. 1:3, "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who according to His abundant mercy has begotten us again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead,

1 Pet. 1:4, "to an inheritance incorruptible and undefiled and that does not fade away, reserved in heaven for you,

1 Pet. 1:5, "who are kept by the power of God through faith for salvation ready to be revealed in the last time." 1 Pet. 1:3, "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who according to His abundant mercy has begotten us again to a <u>living [Phase 2] hope</u> [PSED] through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead,

PSED = Personal Sense of Eternal Destiny

THREE ENEMIES OF THE CHRISTIAN

- 1. <u>Satan</u> wants to swallow us up: 1 Pet. 5:8, "your adversary the devil walks about like a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour."
- 2. <u>The world</u> wants to force us into its mold: Rom. 12:1, "Do not be conformed to this world."
- 3. <u>The flesh</u> wants to devour us like a wild animal: Gen. 4:7, "Sin is crouching at the door."

1 Pet. 1:4, "to an inheritance incorruptible and undefiled and that does not fade away, reserved in heaven for you,

1 Pet. 1:5, "who are kept by the power of God through faith for salvation ready to be revealed in the last time." Rom. 8:16, "The Spirit Himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God,

Rom. 8:17, "and if children, heirs also, <u>heirs</u> of God, and fellow heirs with Christ if indeed we suffer with Him in order that we may also be glorified with Him." 1 Pet. 1:4, "to an inheritance incorruptible and undefiled and that does not fade away, reserved in heaven [Phase 3] for you,"

- perf pass part fem sing acc
- to keep, to guard
- The perfect tense indicates a completed or finished action in past time.
- Thus God in eternity past secured this inheritance for each of us.

1 Pet. 1:4, "to an inheritance incorruptible and undefiled and that does not fade away, reserved in heaven for <u>you</u>,"

> σύ su acc plur 2nd Person <u>PLURAL;</u> <u>Y'ALL;</u> **Indicates that the** inheritance applies to all of his readers, not just the obedient ones or the overcomers.

1 Pet. 1:5, "who are kept by the <u>power</u> of God through faith for salvation ready to be revealed in the last time."

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δύναμις *dunamis* dat fem sing power, strength, capability; authority; (military) force Matt. 22:29, "Jesus answered and said to them, 'You are mistaken, not knowing the Scriptures [D/O] nor the power of God.'"

D/O = Doctrinal Orientation

Rom. 15:13, "Now may the God of hope [PSED] fill you with all joy [+H] and peace in by believing, that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit."

PSED = Personal Sense of Eternal Destiny +H = Perfect Happiness 2 Cor. 12:9, "And He said to me, 'My grace [G/O] is sufficient for you, for My strength is made perfect in weakness.' Therefore most gladly [+H] I will rather boast in my infirmities, that the <u>power of Christ</u> may rest upon me.

2 Cor. 12:10, "Therefore I take pleasure [+H] in infirmities, in reproaches, in needs, in persecutions, in distresses, for Christ's sake. For when I am weak, then I am strong."

G/O = Grace Orientation +H = Perfect Happiness Eph. 1:18, "[that] the eyes of your understanding being enlightened; that you may know [D/O] what is the hope [PSED] of His calling, what are the riches of the glory of His inheritance [PSED] in the saints,

Eph. 1:19, "and what is the exceeding greatness of His power toward us who believe [FRD], according to the working of <u>His mighty power</u>

Eph. 1:20, "which He worked in Christ when He raised Him from the dead and seated Him at His right hand in the heavenly places," D/O = Doctrinal Orientation PSED = Personal Sense of Eternal Destiny FRD = Faith-Rest Drill 1 Pet. 1:5, "who are kept by the power of God <u>through faith</u> for salvation ready to be revealed in the last time."

dia with the genitive of *pisteuo* frequently means Phase 1 faith for justification (Rom. 3:22; Eph. 2:8–9; Gal. 2:16; Phil. 3:9).

However, it also means Phase 2 sanctification, i.e., the Faith-Rest Drill in 2 Cor. 5:7; Heb. 6:12; 11:33. 1 Pet. 1:5, "who are kept by the power of God <u>through faith</u> [FRD] for salvation ready to be revealed in the last time."

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God's POWER is primary, we access through the pipeline of faith.

1 Pet. 1:6, "In this you greatly rejoice, though now for a little while, if need be, you have been grieved by various trials,

1 Pet. 1:7, "that <u>the genuineness of your</u> <u>faith</u>, [FRD] being much more precious than gold that perishes, though it is tested by fire, may be found to praise, honor, and glory at the revelation of Jesus Christ,"

1 Pet. 1:8, "whom having not seen you love. Though now you do not see Him, <u>yet</u> <u>believing</u> [FRD], you rejoice with joy inexpressible and full of glory, 1 Pet. 1:9, "receiving <u>the end of your faith</u> [FRD]—the salvation of your souls.

Both acts of faith are in this life, hence Phase 2, thus the "salvation" or deliverance of the life (cf., James 1:21)

James 1:21, "Therefore lay aside all filthiness and overflow of wickedness, and receive with meekness the implanted word, which is able to save your souls (life)."

2 Pet. 1:3, "as His divine power has given to us all things that pertain to life and godliness, through the knowledge of Him who called us by glory and virtue,

2 Pet. 1:4, "by which <u>have been given to us</u> <u>exceedingly great and precious promises</u>, that <u>through these</u> you may be partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust." 1 Pet. 1:5, "who are kept by the power of God through faith [FRD] for <u>salvation</u> ready to be revealed in the last time."

1 Pet. 1:5, "who are kept by the power of God through faith [FRD] for <u>salvation</u> [Phase 2] ready to be revealed in the last time."

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But what kind of salvation is this? CONCLUSION: This is Phase 2 sanctification, deliverance through the fiery trials. 1 Pet. 1:6, "In this you greatly rejoice, though now for a little while, if need be, you have been grieved by various trials,"

1 Pet. 4:12, "Beloved, do not think it strange concerning the fiery trial which is to try you, as though some strange thing happened to you;" 1 Pet. 1:5, "who are kept by the power of God through faith [FRD] for salvation [Phase 2] <u>ready</u> to be revealed in the last time."

1 Cor. 10:13, "No temptation has overtaken you except such as is common to man; but God is faithful, who will not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able, but with the temptation will also make the way of escape, that you may be able to bear it." 1 Pet. 1:5, "who are kept by the power of God through faith [FRD] for salvation [Phase 3] prepared to be revealed in <u>the last time</u>."

Does "last time" refer to the future end times, or to the present Church Age?

2 Tim. 3:1, "But know this, that in the last days perilous times will come:"

Heb. 1:2, "has in <u>these last days</u> spoken to us by His Son, whom He has appointed heir of all things, through whom also He made the worlds;"

1 Pet. 1:20, "He indeed was foreordained before the foundation of the world, but was manifest in <u>these last times</u> for you" 1 Pet. 1:10, "Of <u>this salvation</u> the prophets have inquired and searched carefully, who prophesied of the grace that would come to you,
