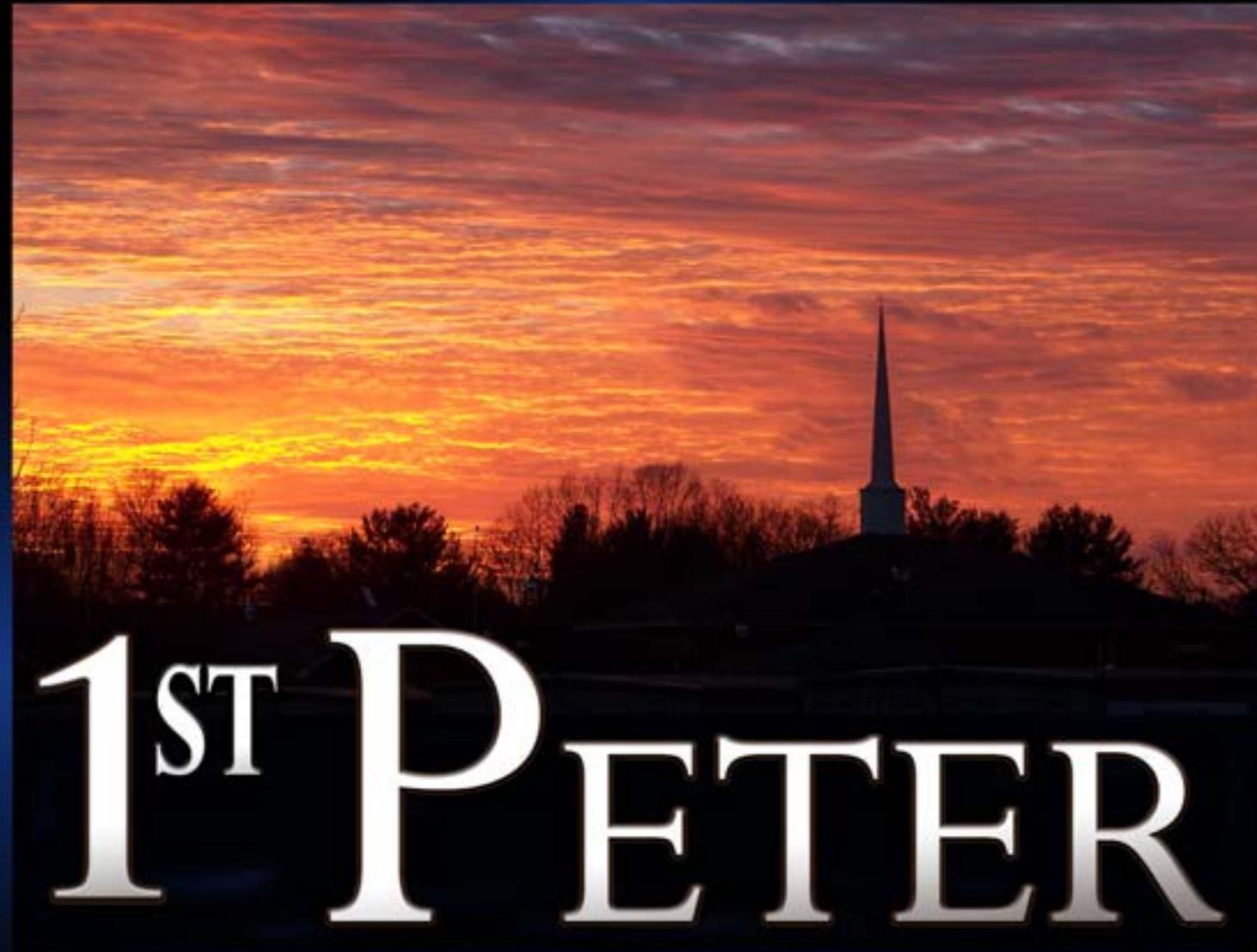

The Role of Joy

- 1. Joy here is a supernatural joy, a gift of Jesus to believers.**

John 15:11, “These things I have spoken to you, that My joy may remain in you, and that your joy may be full.”

The Role of Joy

2. This JOY is a product of walking by the Spirit.

Rom. 15:13, “Now may the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.”

The Role of Joy

2. This JOY is a product of walking by the Spirit.

Gal. 5:22, “But the fruit of the Spirit is love, JOY, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness,”

The Role of Joy

3. This JOY is not mutually exclusive of experiencing sorrow or grief.

John 16:20, “Most assuredly, I say to you that you will weep and lament, but the world will rejoice; and you will be sorrowful [*lupeo*], but your sorrow [*lupe*] will be turned into joy.”

John 16:22, “Therefore you now have sorrow [*lupe*]; but I will see you again and your heart will rejoice, and your joy no one will take from you.”

The Role of Joy

4. This JOY is based on thinking on the basis of God's Word. James 1:2

1 Pet. 1:6, "In this, [vv. 3–5 content] you greatly rejoice!!"

The Role of Joy

5. This JOY is often expressed in and through intense adversity, suffering, and grief.

2 Cor. 8:2, “that in a great trial of affliction the abundance of their joy and their deep poverty abounded in the riches of their liberality.”

pres mid indic 2 plur

Grammatically it may have the sense of an imperative.

To exult, rejoice, to be exceedingly joyful.

REJOICING

Matt. 5:10, “Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness’ sake, For theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Matt. 5:11, “Blessed are you when they revile and persecute you, and say all kinds of evil against you falsely for My sake.

Matt. 5:12, “Rejoice [*chairo*] and be exceedingly glad [*agalliao*], for great *is* your reward in heaven, for so they persecuted the prophets who were before you.”

REJOICING
