

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Philippians 2:5, "Have this same mental attitude in yourselves which was also in Christ Jesus,"

<u>Philippians 2:6, "who, although He</u> existed in the <u>form of God</u>, did not regard <u>equality with God</u> a thing to be <u>grasped</u>," WHO (Lord Jesus Christ) although He eternally existed with <u>identical essence</u> to God [mode of existence], *yet* He <u>did</u> <u>NOT think</u>

Is this thinking, this mental attitude, part of His Deity . . . or His humanity? WHO (Lord Jesus Christ) although He eternally existed with identical essence to God, *yet* HE did NOT think EQUALITY WITH GOD A CLAIM TO BE ASSERTED

HE EMPTIED HIMSELF

BY MEANS OF TAKING THE FORM (NATURE) OF A SERVANT

AND

BY MEANS OF COMING INTO EXISTENCE IN THE PHYSICAL FORM OF A MAN.

tapeino,w, *tapeinoo*, aorist active indicative 3P "to humble, to see oneself in proper relation to reality, to place under authority" <u>Philippians 2:8, "Being found in</u> appearance as a man, He <u>humbled</u> Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross."

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"to humble, to see oneself in proper relation to reality, to place under authority" eu`ri,skw, *heurisko*, aorist passive participle anarthrous, <u>used as a main verb</u>. "<u>he was found</u>..." Philippians 2:8, "Being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross."

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gi,nomai, *ginomai* participle aorist middle participle of means: "he humbled himself <u>by</u> <u>becoming obedient</u>" <u>Philippians 2:8,</u> "Being found in <u>appearance</u> as a man, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross."

sch/ma, *schema*, dative neuter singular "the generally recognized state or form in which something appears, <u>outward appearance,</u> form, or shape." <u>Heb 2:10</u>, "For it was fitting for Him, for whom are all things, and through whom are all things, in bringing many sons to glory, <u>to perfect</u> the author of their salvation through sufferings." <u>Heb 2:10</u>, "For it was fitting for Him, for whom are all things, and through whom are all things, in bringing many sons to glory, to perfect the author of their salvation through sufferings."

teleio,w, *teleioo*, To bring to maturity, completion

The Servant's Exaltation (Phil. 2:9–11)

All are active voice [the believer does the action] imperatives [mandates, not options]

<u>1 Pet. 2:18,</u> "Servants, be <u>submissive</u> to your masters with all <u>fear</u>, not only to the good and gentle, but also to the harsh.

<u>1 Pet. 2:19</u>, "For this is commendable, if because of conscience toward God one endures grief, suffering wrongfully."


These participles in 2:18: servants, *be submissive*; 3:1: wives, *be submissive*; 3:7: husbands, *dwell* ... explain how the imperatives are fulfilled. ὑποτάσσω hupotassō pres mid part masc plur nom, i.e., submit yourselves imperatival participle, to subject; to submit Eph. 5:21, "submitting to one another in the fear of God. [result of "be filled by means of the Holy Spirit!" Eph. 5:18]


Eph. 5:22, "Wives, submit to your own husbands, as to the Lord."

Eph. 5:25, "Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ also loved the church and gave Himself for her," <u>1 Pet. 3:1</u>, "Wives, likewise, be submissive to your own husbands, that even if some do not obey the word, they, without a word, may be won by the conduct of their wives,

<u>1 Pet. 3:2, "when they observe your chaste</u> conduct accompanied by fear." <u>1 Pet. 3:1</u>, "In the same way, wives, be subject to your own husbands. Then, even if some are disobedient to the word, they will be won over without a word by the way you live,

<u>1 Pet. 3:2, "when they see your pure and</u> reverent conduct." [NET]

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The Doctrine of the Dance

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Lam. 5:15, "The joy of our heart has ceased; Our dance has turned into mourning."

1. Dancing involves teamwork with clearly defined rules and roles for each member of the team.

Eph. 5:22–33; Col. 3:18–4:1; 1 Peter 3:1–7 2. Two people cannot dance together without a common goal.

Amos 3:3, KJV "How can two walk together unless they are in agreement?"

3. Like any team, dancing has specifically defined roles for the two participants. In dancing, the male is the leader and the woman is the follower. This means the man initiates, plans, directs the movements of the woman.
