<u>2 Corinthians 5:10</u>, "For <u>we must</u> all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, that each one may receive the things done in the body, according to what he has done, whether good or bad."

δει/, *dei*, "it is necessary, one must, one ought to"

- 1. There will be an evaluation of every believer's life.
- 2. The issue isn't sin or salvation, but to reward faithfulness.
- 3. The Judgment Seat of Christ is only for believers.
- 4. The Judgment Seat is described in cultural terms: A Bema seat could refer to either the place of civil adjudication or the seat of the judges in an athletic context.



John 5:29, "and will come forth; those who did the good deeds to a resurrection of life, those who committed the evil deeds to a resurrection of judgment." Daniel 12:2, "Many of those who sleep in the dust of the ground will awake, these to everlasting life, but the others to disgrace and everlasting contempt." <u>Rev. 20:7</u>, "Now when the thousand years have expired, Satan will be released from his prison

<u>Rev. 20:8</u>, "and will go out to deceive the nations which are in the four corners of the earth, Gog and Magog, to gather them together to battle, whose number is as the sand of the sea." <u>Rev. 20:9</u>, "They went up on the breadth of the earth and surrounded the camp of the saints and the beloved city. And fire came down from God out of heaven and devoured them.

<u>Rev. 20:10</u>, "The devil, who deceived them, was cast into the lake of fire and brimstone where the beast and the false prophet are. And they will be tormented day and night forever and ever." <u>Rev. 20:11</u>, "Then I saw a great white throne and Him who sat on it, from whose face the earth and the heaven fled away. And there was found no place for them." Rev. 20:12, "And I saw the dead, small and great, standing before God, and books were opened. And another book was opened, which is the Book of Life. And the dead were judged according to their works, by the things which were written in the books." <u>Rev. 20:13</u>, "The sea gave up the dead who were in it, and Death and Hades delivered up the dead who were in them. This is the key question:

Does "works" include sin, is it a synonym for sin, or is it restricted to only "good works," i.e., morality?

Can an unbeliever produce a neutral morality that is "good?"

<u>Rev. 20:14</u>, "Then Death and Hades were cast into the lake of fire. This is the second death."

<u>Rev. 20:15</u>, "And anyone not found written in the Book of Life was cast into the lake of fire."

Not Condemned for Sin's Penalty

<u>Col. 2:13,</u> "And you, being dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, He has made alive together with Him, having forgiven you all trespasses,

<u>Col. 2:14</u>, "having wiped out the handwriting of requirements that was against us, which was contrary to us. And He has taken it out of the way, having nailed it to the cross." "This section [Col. 2:4–3:4] contains ... one of the most important of St. Paul's descriptions of what is achieved by the death of Christ, and one of his most emphatic reiterations of the theme of the incorporation of believers in Christ."

<u>Pres ptcp</u> is at the same time as the action of the verb

Temporal: When you were dead in your trespasses ... Concessive: Though you were dead in your trespasses ...

Our status was DEAD—not physically, but spiritually

<u>Col. 2:13,</u> "And you, when you were dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, He <u>has made alive together</u> with Him, having forgiven you all trespasses,"

Eph. 2:5, "even though we were dead in our transgressions, God made us alive together with Christ (by grace you have been saved), Eph. 2:6, "and raised us up with Him, and seated us with Him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus." <u>Col. 2:13,</u> "And you, when you were dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, He <u>has made alive together</u> with Him, having forgiven you all trespasses,"

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What is the relationship between forgiveness and being made alive?

<u>Col. 2:13,</u> "And you, when you were dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, He has made alive together with Him, <u>having</u> forgiven you all trespasses,"

χαρίζομαι *charízomai*; aor act ptcp mns adverbial of <u>cause</u>:

- 1. to give freely or graciously
- 2. to cancel a sum of money or debt that is owed, Luke 7:42ff

3. to forgive or pardon an action

<u>Col. 2:13,</u> "And you, *when* you were dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, He has made alive together with Him, [because he had] <u>having forgiven you all</u> trespasses,"

2. to cancel a sum of money or debt that is owed, Luke 7:42ff

"<u>because</u> he had already forgiven/ canceled" adverbial participle of cause

FOUR Categories of <u>Forgiveness</u>

1. Forgiveness directed toward God, where the justice of God cancels the debt of sin. For all mankind without distinction. *Forensic Forgiveness*

<u>Col. 2:13,</u> "And you, [when you were] dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, <u>He has made alive together with</u> <u>Him, [BECAUSE He canceled]</u> all [the legal guilt of your] trespasses,

<u>Col. 2:14</u>, "having wiped out the handwriting of requirements that was against us, which was contrary to us. And He has taken it out of the way, having nailed it to the cross."

FOUR Categories of <u>Forgiveness</u>

- 1. Forgiveness directed toward God, where the justice of God cancels the debt of sin. For all mankind without distinction. *Forensic Forgiveness*
- 2. Forgiveness positionally in Christ. Eph. 1:7
- 3. Experiential forgiveness. 1 John 1:9
- 4. Relational forgiveness. Eph. 4:32

The Words for "Forgive"

ἀφίημι v. (*aphiēmi*), "let go, cancel, remit, leave, forgive"

ἄφεσις n. (*aphesis*), "release, pardon, cancellation, forgiveness"

Emphasizes the *act* of forgiveness

χαρίζομαι (*charizomai*), show favour or kindness, give as a favour, to be gracious to someone, to pardon

Emphasizes the *attitude* of forgiveness

The Words for "Forgive"

Matt. 26:28, "For this is My blood of the new covenant, which is shed for many for the <u>remission</u> of sins."

ἀφίημι v. (*aphiēmi*), "let go, cancel, remit, leave, forgive" ἄφεσις n. (*aphesis*), "release, pardon, cancellation, forgiveness"

Emphasizes the *act* of forgiveness

The Words for "Forgive"

Heb. 9:22, "And according to the law almost all things are purified with blood, and without shedding of blood there is no remission." <u>Col 2:13,</u> "And you, though [or when] you were dead in your transgressions and the uncircumcision of your flesh, <u>He</u> <u>made you alive together with Him</u>,

Psa. 51:9, "Hide Your face from my sins, and <u>blot out</u> all my iniquities."

Isa. 43:25, "I, even I, am He who blots out your transgressions for My own sake; And I will not remember your sins."

ָמָקָה (*māḥâ*) I, **wipe, wipe out.**

Acts 3:19, "Repent therefore and be converted, that your sins <u>may be blotted</u> out, so that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord," <u>Col 2:14, "[when] He canceled</u> out the <u>certificate of debt</u> consisting of <u>decrees</u> against us, which was hostile to us; and He has taken it out of the way, having nailed it to the cross;"

"to fasten; to nail to"

By nailing it to the cross When nailing it to the cross

- 1. Sin is not the issue at salvation. The individual's sin is not the issue at salvation. Your sin is not the issue at salvation.
- 2. This does not mean that sin, the sin penalty, and the reality of a person's spiritual death is ignored, but that personal sin is not the focal point.
- 3. The focal point is grace; the emphasis is on forgiveness in the sense of Christ having paid it all at the cross.
- 4. The point of application beyond the Gospel is that if Jesus paid it ALL at the cross, then He solved our greatest problem and can therefore be sufficient to solve any other problem we have in life.
