RULE #1: THE GOLDEN RULE OF INTERPRETATION

"When the plain sense of Scripture makes common sense, seek no other sense; therefore take every word at its primary, ordinary, usual, literal meaning unless the facts of the immediate context, studied in light of related passages and axiomatic and fundamental truths indicate clearly otherwise."

Rule #2: The analogy of Scripture means that Scripture is compared with other Scripture in order to get the full picture.

Rule #3: Clear Scripture is used to interpret statements that might be unclear or ambiguous.

Contemporary Spirituality

- In 2004 86% of Americans claim to believe in "god." Down from 98% in 1967; 90% in 1998. By 2010 80% believe in God; 12% in a universal spirit.
- 2. 1994–58% needed spiritual growth; 1999–78% needed spiritual growth. 43% said their interest in spirituality had increased recently. **2005**–57% consider spirituality important part of their life.
- 3. Three reasons:

Profit motive

Smorgasbord definition: anything can be spiritual The uniquely modern idea of the "self" "It is the new lingua franca. It's the experiential aspect of religion, something deeply felt. Each person seems to have his or her own, and it has an incredibly wide appeal right now."

Key Biblical Terms

πνευματικός pneumatikos spiritual, something related to the "spirit"

εὖσέβεια *eusebeia* usually translated "godliness" but refers to the spiritual life.

NIDNTT: "devoutness, piety, fear of God, religion"

Generally describes the positive characteristics of one who is growing spiritually.

1 Tim. 6:11, "But you, O man of God, flee these things and pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, patience, gentleness."

Titus 2:12, "teaching us that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously, and godly in the present age,"

2 Pet. 3:11, "Therefore, since all these things will be dissolved, what manner of persons ought you to be in holy conduct and godliness,"

The Importance of Context

Matt. 4:8, "Again, the devil took Him up on an exceedingly high mountain, and showed Him all the kingdoms of the world and their glory.

NOT given for sanctification, but for leadership

Conclusion:

Since Paul is quoting from Old Testament passages regarding the inability to hear and see apart from the Spirit,

the ministry of the Spirit to which he is referring must be one that is NOT unique to the New Testament.

The only ministry of the Holy Spirit which fits this is <u>regeneration</u>.

So at 62 minutes a week that comes down to 10.5 minutes a day.



1. Terminology

Spiritual birth, or being "born again." At the moment a person expresses faith alone in Christ alone the Holy Spirit creates a human spirit and God the Father simultaneously imputes eternal life to the human spirit and the believer passes from spiritual death to spiritual life (John 3:3–7; Titus 3:5).

Regeneration is a technical term derived from the Greek:

paliggenesia: 2× Titus 3:5; Matt. 19:28

gennao anothen: literally born again or born from above (John 3)

anagennaō to beget again, cause to be born again

1. Definition: baptism [Greek, βαπτιζω (baptizo), "to dip, to plunge, to immerse"] As an action it signified the identification of someone with an action, a person, an object, or a new status in life.

Denotation (literal meaning): immersion Connotation (figurative meaning): identification

Acts 10:44, "While Peter was still speaking these words, the Holy Spirit fell upon all those who heard the word.

Acts 10:45, "And those of the circumcision who believed were astonished, as many as came with Peter, because the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out on the Gentiles also.

Acts 10:46, "For they heard them speak with tongues and magnify God. Then Peter answered,

Acts 10:47, "Can anyone forbid water, that these should not be baptized who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?"

Acts 16:14, "Now a certain woman named Lydia heard us. She was a seller of purple from the city of Thyatira, who worshiped God. The Lord opened her heart to heed the things spoken by Paul.

Acts 16:15, "And when she and her household were baptized, she begged us, saying, 'If you have judged me to be faithful to the Lord, come to my house and stay.' So she persuaded us."

Acts 16:31, "So they said, 'Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and you will be saved, you and your household.'

Acts 16:32, "Then they spoke the word of the Lord to him and to all who were in his house. Acts 16:33, "And he took them the same hour of the night and washed their stripes. And immediately he and all his family were baptized.

Acts 16:34, "Now when he had brought them into his house, he set food before them; and he rejoiced, having believed in God with all his household."

Baptism is also used for death, in the "baptism" of Christ.

Matt. 20:22, "But Jesus answered and said, 'You do not know what you ask. Are you able to drink the cup that I am about to drink, and be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with?' They said to Him, 'We are able.' " (cf., Mark 10:38)

Luke 12:50, "But I have a baptism to be baptized with, and how distressed I am till it is accomplished!"

5. There is much confusion over the Baptism of the Holy Spirit since the beginning of the Pentecostal movement.

Pentecostals believed in two baptisms with/by the Holy Spirit-one at salvation, and one after salvation.

The problem derives from the English of the KJV.

Matthew 3:11, "I indeed baptize you with water unto repentance: but he that cometh after me is mightier than I, whose shoes I am not worthy to bear: he shall baptize you with the Holy Ghost, and with fire:"

1 Corinthians 12:13, "For by cone Spirit are we all baptized into one body, whether we be Jews or Gentiles, whether we be bond or free; and have been all made to drink into one Spirit."

Matthew 3:11, "I indeed baptize you with water unto repentance: but he that cometh after me is mightier than I, whose shoes Lam not worthy to bear: he shall baptize you with the Holy Spirit,

and with fire:"

Problem:

Pentecostal-Charismatic theology ends up with two baptisms of the Holy Spirit:

one by the Holy Spirit at salvation,

one with the Holy Spirit after salvation.

6. The Baptism of the Holy Spirit (BHS) was first prophesied by John the Baptist at the incarnation; and Jesus Christ in Acts 1:5.

At those times the BHS was future.

7. In Matthew, the subject of the active voice verb is Jesus Christ. It is Jesus Christ who performs the action of baptism by means of the Holy Spirit.

Matthew 3:11, "I indeed baptize you with water unto repentance: but HE that cometh after me is mightier than I, whose shoes I am not worthy to bear: HE shall baptize you with the Holy Spirit, and with fire:"

Matt. 3:11, "As for me, I baptize [pres active ind] you with water [en hudati] for [eis] repentance,

8. Conclusion

Rom. 6:3, with a passive voice verb states the direction of the baptism, into [eis] Christ, i.e., the new body of Christ—the Church (1 Cor. 12:13).

The REASON for this baptism is now stated-

Rom. 6:3, "Or do you not know that as many of us as were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death?

Rom. 6:4, "Therefore we were buried with Him through <u>baptism into death</u>, [that just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father], even so we also should <u>walk in newness of life</u>."
