

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


Psa. 34:8,

"Oh, taste and see that the LORD is good; Blessed is the man who trusts in Him!"

Psa. 33:18, "Behold, the eye of the LORD is on those who fear Him, on those who hope in His mercy,"

Psa. 34:15, "The eyes of the LORD are on the righteous, and His ears are open to their cry." Psa. 34:0, "A Psalm of David when he pretended madness before Abimelech, who drove him away, and he departed."



<u>1 Sam. 21:10</u>, "Then David arose and fled that day from before Saul, and went to Achish the king of Gath.

<u>1 Sam. 21:11</u>, "And the servants of Achish said to him, 'Is this not David the king of the land? Did they not sing of him to one another in dances, saying: "Saul has slain his thousands, and David his ten thousands" '?" <u>1 Sam. 21:12</u>, "Now David took these words to heart, and was very much afraid of Achish the king of Gath.

<u>1 Sam. 21:13</u>, "So he changed his behavior before them, pretended madness in their hands, scratched on the doors of the gate, and let his saliva fall down on his beard." <u>1 Sam. 21:14</u>, "Then Achish said to his servants, 'Look, you see the man is insane. Why have you brought him to me?

Outline of Psalm 34

A. David declares his praise to God, Psa. 34:1–10.

- 1. David vows to praise God and to call for others to join him in praise, Psa. 34:1–3.
- 2. David describes God's deliverance, Psa. 34:4–7.
- 3. David exhorts others to trust the LORD for protection and provision, Psa. 34:8–10.
- B. The descriptive praise instructs others to praise God, Psa. 34:11–22.
 - 1. David calls upon others to learn and experience God's goodness, Psa. 34:11–12.
 - 2. David instructs others of God's goodness to the righteous and those in need, Psa. 34:13–22.

Synonymous Parallelism

The thought expressed in the first part of the verse is repeated in the second part, in different but equivalent terms (Psa. 2:4; 19:1; 36:1, 2; 103:11, 12; Prov. 3:13–18)

"I will <u>bless</u> the LORD at all times; His <u>praise</u> shall continually be in my mouth."


"My soul shall [continuously] make its boast in the LORD; The <u>humble</u> shall hear of it and be glad."
