- **Barton, David and Tim Barton. *The American Story: The Beginnings*. Second Edition. Aledo, TX: WallBuilder Press, 2021. The Bartons do a fine job with extensive footnotes and documentation. Their focus is telling history through the people involved. The greatest weakness I have found is that they do not distinguish "Christian" sect leaders such as William Penn (Quaker), and Unitarians, i.e., Charles Chauncy, Jonathan Mayhew, and others such as Charles Grandison Finney who are not biblically orthodox Christians with heretical views, from biblically orthodox Christians. However, their emphasis and documentation in numerous areas brings out a stronger emphasis on the role Christianity played in the nation's founding than almost all standard histories. The careful historian should weigh the differences, but I usually side with the Bartons. Also, the volume desperately needs an index, which should have been included in the Second Edition.
