

JAMES F. MYERS MINISTRIES: resource for teaching memory verses in any language or any children's Bible versions. [Directory \(open\)](#)

These Bible verses are high resolution graphics ready to be copied or printed. They can be copied on standard size paper for small groups or they can be enlarged to any size needed. The quality will be good. The verses are in two folders: with text and no text. The no text have only the graphics without words. Otherwise they are identical.

This series was specifically designed to be flexible to the many different needs of those teaching the Bible. The memory verses were originally visualized from the NKJV, but can be used as a pattern for and modified for any Bible version by using the second set which are the same visualized verses but without words. I have also included a Hebrews 4:12, power point in the NKJV and another Hebrews 4:12 power point without words. These may be used as power point or copied, but the copy quality will not be as good as the professionally printed digital verses.

Suggested uses

For Churches - teaching resources for children, One of the biggest problems today in teaching memory verses is the confusion of many different versions and translations used in the new children's Bibles.

For churches using the NKJV: Use the NKJV verses which are ready to be copied. Copy or Print or laminate for long term, permanent use. Resize to meet the need of your class or storage problems. Make a copy of the visualized memory verses without words for reviewing verses or as students' work sheets for children, which are of writing age, to fill in the text or key words. Use as take home papers for parents to help review the verses with their children.

For Churches using other versions: Some churches who use the AWANA Program sometimes use other versions of the Bible and sometimes the children in your ministry may have their own Bibles in which the versions may differ. Choose the version you prefer. Use the memory NKJV verses as a pattern to customize the visualized verses without words. Write in by hand, or cut and paste on computer, or use a computer program to add keywords or text from your preferred version. Make another copy of the visualized verses without words to use for reviewing verses or as student's work sheets if the children are of writing age. These can also be used as take home papers for the parents to see what the children are learning and help the child learn their verses. These could be printed out on regular size paper.

For other Children's Ministries outside the church

Same uses as above. The ability to print these in different formats provides flexibility for size and weight according to the occasion.

Family personal use

Having a visualized memory verse will greatly help children to learn their Bible verses. Use as mentioned above but with additional benefits.

To save time and effort, if you have a computer, you don't have to print out the verses, just use the digital copy on your or their computer. But to be successful, set a specific time every day to learn or review the verses with your children. Don't expect them to go to their computers and look up verses instead of playing games. They need a parent's guidance, help, and encouragement to learn the verses.

The verses will have a greater use if you do print out the verses as worksheets or resize and print out small card to be used on a mirror or refrigerator. Print them out in larger sizes for posters to hang in the children's room or around the house for the children to see. Tip about hanging verses: change them often; if they hang for too many weeks in the same place, the child will no longer notice them, even on their own bedroom wall.

Multilingual or foreign mission

Use the NKJV as a pattern to translate verses into the local language or dialect.

Use the visualized verses without words to write-in keywords or text in the foreign language.

Make a second copy without words or text for reviewing the verses.

Make a second copy for children to use as a worksheet writing in keywords or text in their own language.

Take the verses on a flash drive to save baggage weight or avoid damage in traveling. Make sure before you leave that copying AND a computer are available where you are going.

If you must carry the verses on paper, use thin, small pages for small groups but carry them in a gallon size, ziplock bag. For larger copies use the jumbo sized, ziplock bags.

Leave the visuals and/or digital copies with the churches and teachers to continue being used there. You don't need to carry the extra weight of paper home with you if you have everything on the flash drive.
