

8 Judgments 5 Resurrections

In the NT, “order, sequence, or

μέρος *meros*, “part, share, portion, lot”

The first death is bodily, so, too is the second.

Matthew 10:28, “Do not fear those who kill the body but are unable to kill the soul; but rather fear Him who is able to destroy both soul and body in hell.”


Rev. 20:11, “Then I saw a great white throne and Him who sat on it, from whose face the earth and the heaven fled away. And there was found no place for them.”

the books.”**


Rev. 20:13, “The sea gave up the dead who were in it, and Death and Hades delivered up the dead who were in them. And they were judged, each one according to his works.”



Question:

What about statements that a person dies in their sin?

“in your sins,” John 8:24,

1 Cor. 15:17, “And if Christ is not risen, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins!”

“in your sins” = being spiritually dead, Eph 2:1

“in your sins” is not the same as “for your sins”
