# What Made Them Different?

1. **Faith.** They had the will, the gumption, the guts to believe God and take up the challenge to walk by faith and not by sight.

**2 Cor 5:7, “For we walk by faith, not by sight.”**

2. **Since they had a biblical view of reality, their norms and standards, their plans and procedures, their core values were turned upside down by the Word of God. They were willing to totally submit to the plan of God and become servants of God, servants of Christ.**

**Deuteronomy 6:13, “You shall fear the LORD  
your God and serve [*abad*] Him, and shall take  
oaths in His name.”**

**Romans 12:1, “I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, *which is your reasonable service* [λατρεία *latreía*].”**

**Matthew 20:28, “just as the Son of Man did not come to be served [διακονέω *diakonéō*], but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many.”**

**Matthew 23:11, “But he who is greatest among you shall be your servant [διάκονος *diákonos*].”**

**Luke 16:13, “No servant [οἰκέτης *oikétēs*] can serve [δουλεύω *douleúō*] two masters; for either he will hate the one and love the other, or else he will be loyal to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon.”**
