    - 2C Solomon's wisdom demonstrated 3:16–4:34

מְלַרְ *mālak* in the hiphel is causative, Solomon acknowledges God's sovereignty. Proverbs 3:34, "Surely He scorns the scornful, but gives grace to the humble."

1 Peter 5:5, "Likewise you younger people, submit yourselves to *your* elders. Yes, all of *you* be submissive to one another, and be clothed with humility, for 'God resists the proud, but gives grace to the humble.'

1 Peter 5:6, "Therefore humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God, that He may exalt you in due time,"

Proverbs 11:2, "When pride comes, then comes shame; but with the humble *is* wisdom."

Proverbs 16:19, "Better to be of a humble spirit with the lowly, than to divide the spoil with the proud."

Proverbs 29:23, "A man's pride will bring him low, but the humble in spirit will retain honor."

שָׁמַע *šāma*: a listening heart, used as an idiom for an obedience.

בִּין biyn: to discern, to be able to intelligently consider and choose wisely.



חֶכְם *hakām*: An adjective meaning wise. This word is used to describe one who is skilled or experienced.

בִּין biyn: A verb meaning to discern, to perceive, to observe, to pay attention to, to be intelligent, to be discreet, to understand.
