Matt. 10:2, "Now the names of the twelve apostles are these: first, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother; James the son of Zebedee, and <u>John</u> his brother;

Matt. 10:3, "Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James the son of Alphaeus, and Lebbaeus, whose surname was Thaddaeus;

Matt. 10:4, "Simon the Cananite, and Judas Iscariot, who also betrayed Him."

John 1:35, "Again, the next day, John stood with two of his disciples."

John 1:43, "The following day Jesus wanted to go to Galilee, and He found Philip and said to him, 'Follow Me.'

John 1:44, "Now Philip was from Bethsaida, the city of Andrew and Peter.

John 1:45, "Philip found Nathanael and said to him, 'We have found Him of whom Moses in the law, and also the prophets, wrote—Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph.'"



John 6:4, "Now the Passover, a feast of the Jews, was near.

John 6:5, "Then Jesus lifted up His eyes, and seeing a great multitude coming toward Him, He said to Philip, 'Where shall we buy bread, that these may eat?'

John 6:6, "But this He said to test him, for He Himself knew what He would do.

John 6:7, "Philip answered Him, 'Two hundred denarii worth of bread is not sufficient for them, that every one of them may have a little.'"

John 14:7, "'If you had known Me, you would have known My Father also; and from now on you know Him and have seen Him.'

John 14:8, "Philip said to Him, 'Lord, show us the Father, and it is sufficient for us.'

John 14:9, "Jesus said to him, 'Have I been with you so long, and yet you have not known Me, Philip? He who has seen Me has seen the Father; so how can you say, "Show us the Father"?

John 14:10, "'Do you not believe that I am in the Father, and the Father in Me? The words that I speak to you I do not speak on My own authority; but the Father who dwells in Me does the works.

John 14:11, "'Believe Me that I am in the Father and the Father in Me, or else believe Me for the sake of the works themselves.'"



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Mark 3:16-19; Luke 6:14-16

Acts 1:13, "And when they had entered, they went up into the upper room where they were staying: Peter, James, John, and Andrew; Philip and <u>Thomas</u>; Bartholomew and Matthew; James the son of Alphaeus and Simon the Zealot; and Judas the son of James."

John 11:16, "Then Thomas, who is called the Twin, said to his fellow disciples, 'Let us also go, that we may die with Him.'"

John 14:5, "Thomas said to Him, 'Lord, we do not know where You are going, and how can we know the way?' "

John 20:24, "Now Thomas, called the Twin, one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came."

John 20:26, "And after eight days His disciples were again inside, and Thomas with them. Jesus came, the doors being shut, and stood in the midst, and said, 'Peace to you!'

John 20:27, "Then He said to Thomas, 'Reach your finger here, and look at My hands; and reach your hand here, and put it into My side. Do not be unbelieving, but believing.'

John 20:28, "And Thomas answered and said to Him, 'My Lord and my God!'" Matt. 10:2, "Now the names of the twelve apostles are these: first, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother; James the son of Zebedee, and John his brother;

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Matt. 13:55, "Is this not the carpenter's son? Is not His mother called Mary?

And His brothers James, Joses, Simon, and Judas?"



John 14:22, "Judas (not Iscariot) said to Him, 'Lord, how is it that You will manifest Yourself to us, and not to the world?' "



John 13:2, "And supper being ended, the devil having already put it into the heart of Judas Iscariot, Simon's son, to betray Him,"

John 13:10, "Jesus said to him, 'He who is bathed needs only to wash his feet, but is completely clean; and you are clean, but not all of you.'

John 13:11, "For He knew who would betray Him; therefore He said, 'You are not all clean.'"

John 13:27, "Now after the piece of bread, Satan entered him."

Mark 5:1, "Then they came to the other side of the sea, to the country of the Gadarenes.

Mark 5:2, "And when He had come out of the boat, immediately there met Him out of the tombs a man with an unclean spirit,

Mark 5:3, "who had his dwelling among the tombs; and no one could bind him, not even with chains,"

with an unclean spirit = en or with an unclean spirit other passages have echo "to have" an unclean spirit

Luke 8:27, "And when He came out onto the land, He was met by a man from the city who was possessed with demons; and who had not put on any clothing for a long time, and was not living in a house, but in the tombs."

Luke 8:30, "Jesus asked him, saying, 'What is your name?' And he said, 'Legion,' because many demons had entered him."

Luke 8:32, "Now a herd of many swine was feeding there on the mountain. So they begged Him that He would permit them to enter them. And He permitted them."
