ἐκδικέω *ekdikeō*

pres act part masc plur nom

- ① to procure justice for someone, grant justice**
- ② to inflict appropriate penalty for wrong done (of special significance in an honor/shame-oriented society) punish, take vengeance for**
- ③ to carry out one’s obligations in a worthy manner, do justice to (BDAG)**

vengeance /^lvɛn(d)ʒ(ə)ns/

- **noun** punishment inflicted or retribution exacted for an injury or wrong.

avenge

- **verb** inflict harm in return for (an injury or wrong).
 - ▶ inflict retribution on behalf of (a wronged person). (OED)
