John 15:1, "I am the true vine, and My Father is the vinedresser.

John 15:2, "Every branch in Me that does not bear fruit He takes away [airo lifts up]; and every branch that bears fruit <u>He prunes</u>, that it may bear more fruit." Airo is a second word around which controversy has swirled.

Kittel lists three meanings: "to lift from the ground," "to lift in order to carry" and "to carry off."

## TDNT airo. The meanings are "to lift from the ground," "to lift in order to carry," and "to carry off."

1. The sense "to lift up" occurs for raising the hand in an oath (Rev. 10:5), raising the face in prayer (Jn. 11:41), and raising the voice in prayer (Acts 4:24). Thus there are two kinds of main branches; the shoot which comes out of the hard timber and promises wood for the next year is called a leafy shoot or else when it is above the scar [caused by tying the branch to the trellis] a fruit-bearing shoot, whereas the other kind of shoot that springs from a year-old branch is always a fruit-bearer.

John 13:2, "Every branch in Me that does not bear fruit, He takes away [ai[rw, airo]; and every branch that bears fruit, He prunes it [kaqaivrw, kathairo] so that it may bear more fruit.

John 13:3, "You are already clean [kaqarov", *kathairos*] because of the word which I have spoken to you."

"There is also left underneath the cross-bar a shoot called the keeper this is a young branch, not longer than three buds, which will provide wood next year if the vine's luxurious growth has used itself up-and another shoot next to it, the size of a wart, called the pilferer is also left, in case the keeper-shoot should fail."

~Pliny

John 15:4, "<u>Abide</u> in Me, and I in you. As the branch cannot <u>bear fruit</u> of itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in Me."












































#### **How Does a Christian Walk?**

Rom. 6:4, "Therefore we were buried with Him through baptism into death, that just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life." Rom. 8:4, "that the righteous requirement of the law might be fulfilled in us who do not walk according to the flesh but according to the Spirit." Gal. 3:1, "O foolish Galatians! Who has bewitched you that you should not obey the truth, before whose eyes Jesus Christ was clearly portrayed among you as crucified?

Gal. 3:2, "This only I want to learn from you: Did you receive the Spirit by the works of the law, or by the hearing of faith?

Gal. 3:3, "Are you so foolish? Having begun in the Spirit, are you now being made perfect by the flesh?" Gal. 2:16, "knowing that a man is not justified by the works of the law but by faith in Jesus Christ, even we have believed in Christ Jesus, that we might be justified by faith in Christ and not by the works of the law; for by the works of the law no flesh shall be justified." Gal. 3:1, "O foolish Galatians! Who has bewitched you that you should not obey the truth, before whose eyes Jesus Christ was clearly portrayed among you as crucified?

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Paraphrase: Walk by means of the Spirit and it will be impossible for you to accomplish the lust of the flesh. Gal. 5:17, "For the flesh lusts against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh; and these are contrary to one another, so that you do not do the things that you wish.

Gal. 5:21, "envy, murders, drunkenness, revelries, and the like; of which I tell you beforehand, just as I also told you in time past, that those who practice such things will not inherit the kingdom of God." Gal. 5:22, "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness,

Gal. 5:23, "gentleness, self-control. Against such there is no law.


Gal. 5:24, "And those who are Christ's have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires."

- **1. Conclusion:** 
  - 1. A Christian can either walk by the Spirit or according to the sin nature.
  - 2. It's either one or the other, but not both/and.
  - 3. When we walk by the Spirit, the Holy Spirit produces character changes in our lives.
  - 4. When we walk according to the sin nature, the traits of the sin nature are manifested.

- 2. Either filled by wine as a false means of spirituality or be filled by means of the Spirit, vs. 11.

filled by means of the Spirit.

The Spirit isn't what we are filled with, the Spirit is what God uses to fill us.



1 John 1:10, "If we say that we have not sinned, we make Him a liar, and His word is not in us."


- 1. Walking by means of the Spirit is equivalent to walking in the light.
- 2. Walking in the light is contrasted to walking in darkness.
- 3. Walking according to the flesh then is equivalent to walking in darkness.
- 4. Walking in darkness means we don't have fellowship with one another, which also means we don't have fellowship with God.

- 5. Every believer sins, the basis for forgiveness is the death of Christ on the Cross.
- 6. At the moment of faith alone in Christ alone we are forgiven of all sins positionally, for the Church Age believer this is realized through the baptism by means of the Holy Spirit.
- 7. However, experientially, we still sin, we still walk according to the sin nature (flesh) and in darkness, so the question is, how do we recover.
- 8. We need to be cleansed of sin experientially (John 13:1–11) which is forgiveness of sin.

 To be spiritual is contrasted with being carnal or walking according to the sin nature. To be spiritual means to walk by means of the Spirit so He can mature us through the Word of God.

The Spirit of God uses the Word of God to mature the child of God to conform us to the character of the Son of God.

Col. 1:10, "that you may walk worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing Him, being fruitful in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God;"
