

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

Deut. 32:4, “He is the Rock, His work is perfect; For all His ways are justice, a God of truth and without injustice; Righteous and upright is He.”


Deut. 32:15, “But Jeshurun grew fat and kicked; You grew fat, you grew thick, you are obese! Then he forsook God who made him, and scornfully esteemed the Rock of his salvation.”

Deut. 32:30, “How could one chase a thousand, and two put ten thousand to flight, unless their Rock had sold them, and the LORD had surrendered them?”

Psa. 75:5, “Do not lift up your horn on high, Do not speak with insolent pride.”

Psa. 94:4, “They pour forth words, they speak arrogantly; All who do wickedness vaunt themselves.”

Isa. 13:11, “I will punish the world for its evil, and the wicked for their iniquity; I will halt the arrogance of the proud, and will lay low the haughtiness of the terrible.”


1. Definition: arrogance is the promotion of self rather than obedience to God.

Isa. 14:13, “For you have said in your heart: ‘I will ascend into heaven, I will exalt my throne above the stars of God; I will also sit on the mount of the congregation on the farthest sides of the north;

Isa. 14:14, “ ‘I will ascend above the heights of the clouds, I will be like the Most High.’ ”

3. Humility is the opposite of Arrogance.

Humility is submission to the authority of God.

Arrogance is assertion of our own authority over against God's.

Num. 12:3, “(Now the man Moses was very humble, more than all men who were on the face of the earth.)”

Prov. 29:23, “A man’s pride will bring him low, but the humble in spirit will retain honor.”

Prov. 11:2, “When pride comes, then comes shame; but with the humble is wisdom.”

Prov. 13:10, “By pride comes nothing but strife, but with the well-advised is wisdom.”

4. Humility is a quality of grace orientation.

5. Arrogance is always related to self-centered goals: it's all about me.

6. Humility as submission to God also rejects arrogance and arrogant speech.

Prov. 8:13, “The fear of the LORD is to hate evil; Pride and arrogance and the evil way and the perverse mouth I hate.”

7. Arrogance is a gateway sin which frequently involves a number of other mental attitude sins as well as sins of the tongue and overt sins:

Jealousy, bitterness, vindictiveness, revenge motivation, self-pity, conceit, inordinate ambition and competition; contempt for others

Lying, boasting, argumentativeness, slander, gossip, and maligning

Physical assaults, theft, adultery, murder

8. One of the most insidious forms of arrogance is pseudo-humility.

Rom. 12:3, “For I say, through the grace given to me, to everyone who is among you, not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think soberly, as God has dealt to each one a measure of faith.”
