What we learned last time:

- **Salvation is not by works, but for good works, Eph. 2:8–10.**
- **All Christians will be evaluated at the Judgment Seat of Christ, 2 Cor. 5:9–10; 1 Cor. 3:12–15.**
- **All are saved eternally, but not all receive rewards, 1 Cor. 3:15.**
- **All run the race, but some are disqualified from receiving crowns, which are rewards, not eternal life, 2 Cor. 9:24–27.**

Three things to remember:

Good works are not inevitable. After being saved we must decide to grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ or not.

Regeneration, being born again, does not minimize our sin nature. It only gives us a new identity and new relationship to God where we are no longer under the tyranny of the sin nature.

The skills we need to control the sin nature are our study.



Conclusions


1. Every Christian builds on the foundation of their salvation: faith in Jesus Christ as the promised and prophesied Messiah, who like the Passover Lamb, died as a sacrifice to take away the sin of the world.
2. We build with **moral** works which God has nothing to do with (wood, hay, straw), or we build by walking by the Spirit (Gal. 5:16) and those divinely enabled **spiritual** works have eternal value (gold, silver, precious stones).
3. Thus there are two kinds of believers, those with rewards, those without, but all are saved. In this life we cannot determine which is which.
4. Our life's work will be evaluated at the Judgment Seat of Christ.

What the Bible Teaches About Christian Suffering




What Have We Learned:

#7 Personal Love for God

- **As the believer learns about God and all God has provided for Him, appreciation increases along with a desire to obey God and serve Him.**
- **Love for God is measured by obedience, not emotion.**
- **Love for God motivates the believer to press on to spiritual maturity.**

Josh. 23:10, “One man of you shall chase a thousand, for the LORD your God is He who fights for you, as He promised you.



The scribes declared that there were 248 affirmative precepts as many as the members of the human body; and 365 negative precepts, as many as the days in the year; the total being 613, the number of letters in the Decalogue.

#7 Personal Love for God

“What is the love of God that is appropriate? It is to love God with an exceedingly strong love until one’s soul is tied to the love of God. One should be ... *like a person who is ‘lovesick,’* whose thoughts cannot turn from his love for a particular woman. He is *preoccupied* with her at all times, whether he is sitting or standing, whether he is eating or drinking. Even more intense should the love of God be in the hearts of those who love him, possessing them always as we are commanded ‘with all your heart and with all your soul.’ ” (Deuteronomy 6:5).
