

The Words for "Forgive"

 $\ddot{\alpha}$ φεσις n. (*aphēsis*), "release, pardon, cancellation, forgiveness"

Emphasizes the *act* of forgiveness.

favour, to be gracious to someone, to pardon

Emphasizes the attitude underlying forgiveness.

ἀφίημι v. (aphiēmi), "let go, cancel, remit, leave, forgive"

FOUR Categories of <u>Forgiveness</u>

- 1. Forgiveness directed toward God, where the justice of distinction. Forensic Forgiveness
- 2. Forgiveness positionally in Christ, Eph. 1:7
- 3. Experiential forgiveness, 1 John 1:9
- 4. Relational forgiveness, Eph. 4:32

Divine Forgiveness:

- God completely removes the sin as a hindrance to our relationship to Him.
- These sins are cast behind Him, removed completely to not be brought up again.

Misconceptions:

It is not permissiveness.

Review context of Matt. 18

1. <u>Key Question</u>:

<u>Matt. 18:1</u>, "At that time the disciples came to Jesus, saying, 'Who then is greatest in the kingdom of heaven?' "

2. In Matt. 18 we find the focus on forgiveness. It begins with a focus on humility. Jesus used a visual training aid to demonstrate His point—a little child.

Little children had no position, rank, or privilege in that culture.

Point: A disciple is not to be concerned about his rank or position, getting his rights.

<u>Matt. 18:4,</u> " 'Therefore whoever humbles himself as this little child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven.' "

3. The warning relates to causing one of these little ones, who represent the disciples, to stumble will incur divine discipline. Everlasting fire is not the eternal lake of fire, but temporal punishment. See Matt. Lessons 102–106 for more detail.

Rabbinical teaching only required forgiveness three times:

It was taught: R. Jose b. Judah said: "If a man commits a transgression, the first, second and third time he is forgiven, the fourth time he is not forgiven, as it is said:

"Rabbi Eliezer son of Rabbi Yose says: If one sins and repents and continues uprightly, he is forgiven before he stirs from the spot. But if one says, 'I shall sin and then repent,' he is forgiven up to three times, but no more."

<u>Prov. 24:16</u>, "For a righteous man may fall seven times and rise again, But the wicked shall fall by calamity."

Luke 17:3, " 'Take heed to yourselves. If your brother sins against you, rebuke him; and if he repents, forgive him.

Release, liberation, forgiveness [EDNT];

cancellation of a debt. [BDAG]

Forgiveness [άφεσις, aphesis]

The act of freeing or liberating or releasing someone from captivity; The act of freeing from an obligation, guilt, or punishment; Pardon,

<u>Matt. 18:28</u>, "But that servant went out and found one of his fellow servants who owed him a hundred denarii; and he laid hands on him and took him by the throat, saying, 'Pay me what you owe!'

Matt. 18:29, "So his fellow servant fell down at his feet and begged him, saying, 'Have patience with me, and I will pay you all.'

Matt. 18:30, "And he would not, but went and threw him into prison till he should pay the debt."

<u>Matt. 18:31</u>, "So when his fellow servants saw what had been done, they were very grieved, and came and told their master all that had been done.

Matt. 18:32, "Then his master, after he had called him, said to him, 'You wicked servant! I forgave you all that debt because you begged me.

<u>Matt. 18:33</u>, " 'Should you not also have had compassion on your fellow servant, just as I had pity on you?' "

<u>Matt. 18:34</u>, "'And his master was angry, and delivered him to the torturers until he should pay all that was due to him. <u>Matt. 18:35</u>, "'So My heavenly Father also will do to you if each of you, from his heart, does not forgive his brother his trespasses.'"
