Expanded translation of Col. 3:16

"You [insert your name] *must* let the Word of Christ make itself at home abundantly and generously in every aspect of your thinking and life with the result that you teach and admonish each other through singing songs, hymns, and spiritual songs in all wisdom, singing with grace in your hearts toward God." The Impact of the World Upon Worship

The Greek word used in Romans 12:2 is not *kosmos*, but *aionos,* a word that emphasizes the time element. It is the spirit of the times or the worldview.

<u>Rom. 12:2</u>, "And do not be pressed into the mold of the <u>spirit</u> of the age [the *zeitgeist* of the culture], but be transformed by making your thinking new, that you may demonstrate that the will of God is good and acceptable and complete."

The Elements and Forms of Worship

Forms and Elements of Worship

- 1. God prohibits the addition of unauthorized forms to worship.
 - Lev. 10:1, "Then Nadab and Abihu, the sons of Aaron, each took his censer and put fire in it, put incense on it, and offered profane fire before the LORD, which He had not commanded them.
 - Lev. 10:2, "So fire went out from the LORD and devoured them, and they died before the LORD. Lev. 10:3, "And Moses said to Aaron, 'This is what the LORD spoke, saying: "By those who come near Me I must be regarded as holy; And before all the people I must be glorified." 'So Aaron held his peace."

The Bible uses a number of terms to express the beauty and excellence of God. These terms establish God as the standard of beauty.

Thus,




4. Beauty is an eternal standard as part of the eternal essence and character of God. Thus we must understand that the criteria is divine, not man-made.

Components Worldview



The American Worldview Inventory 2022 conducted by George Barna and the Cultural Research Center at Arizona Christian University revealed that a majority of today's parents (Millennials) do not possess a biblical worldview. 94% of parents of pre-teens possess a worldview known as Syncretism—"a blending of multiple worldviews in which no single life philosophy is dominant"—and only a sparse 2% actually possess a biblical worldview.

"It seems that most pre-teen parents are unaware—or certainly unfazed—by the the contradiction between calling themselves 'Christian,' but living in ways that repudiate the teachings of Jesus and the principles of the Bible."
