Gen. 16:13, "Then she called the name of the LORD who spoke to her, You-Are-the-God-Who-Sees; for she said, 'Have I also here seen Him who sees me?'" Gen. 22:11, "But the Angel of the LORD called to him from heaven and said, 'Abraham, Abraham!' So he said, 'Here I am.'

Gen. 22:12, "And He said, 'Do not lay your hand on the lad, or do anything to him; for now I know that you fear God, since you have not withheld your son, your only son, from Me.'

Gen. 22:13, "Then Abraham lifted his eyes and looked, and there behind him was a ram caught in a thicket by its horns. So Abraham went and took the ram, and offered it up for a burnt offering instead of his son."

Gen. 22:14, "And Abraham called the name of the place, The-LORD-Will-Provide; as it is said to this day, 'In the Mount of the LORD it shall be provided.'"

Ex. 3:2, "And the Angel of the LORD appeared to him in a flame of fire from the midst of a bush. So he looked, and behold, the bush was burning with fire, but the bush was not consumed.

Ex. 3:3, "Then Moses said, 'I will now turn aside and see this great sight, why the bush does not burn."

Ex. 3:4, "So when the LORD saw that he turned aside to look, God called to him from the midst of the bush and said, 'Moses, Moses!' And he said, 'Here I am.'"

Judg. 6:11, "Now the Angel of the LORD came and sat under the terebinth tree which was in Ophrah, which belonged to Joash the Abiezrite, while his son Gideon threshed wheat in the winepress, in order to hide it from the Midianites.

Judg. 6:12, "And the Angel of the LORD appeared to him, and said to him, 'The LORD is with you, you mighty man of valor!'

Judg. 6:13, "Gideon said to Him, 'O my lord, if the LORD is with us, why then has all this happened to us? And where are all His miracles which our fathers told us about, saying, "Did not the LORD bring us up from Egypt?" But now the LORD has forsaken us and delivered us into the hands of the Midianites.'"

Judg. 6:14, "Then the LORD turned to him and said, 'Go in this might of yours, and you shall save Israel from the hand of the Midianites. Have I not sent you?"

Judg. 6:15, "So he said to Him, 'O my Lord, how can I save Israel? Indeed my clan is the weakest in Manasseh, and I am the least in my father's house."

Judg. 6:16, "And the LORD said to him, 'Surely I will be with you, and you shall defeat the Midianites as one man.'"

Judg. 13:15, "Then Manoah said to the Angel of the LORD, 'Please let us detain You, and we will prepare a young goat for You.'

Judg. 13:16, "And the Angel of the LORD said to Manoah, 'Though you detain Me, I will not eat your food. But if you offer a burnt offering, you must offer it to the LORD.' (For Manoah did not know He was the Angel of the LORD.)"

Judg. 13:17, "Then Manoah said to the Angel of the LORD, 'What is Your name, that when Your words come to pass we may honor You?'

Judg. 13:18, "And the Angel of the LORD said to him, 'Why do you ask My name, seeing it is wonderful?'"

Judg. 13:21, "When the Angel of the LORD appeared no more to Manoah and his wife, then Manoah knew that He was the Angel of the LORD.

Judg. 13:22, "And Manoah said to his wife, 'We shall surely die, because we have seen God!' " Zech. 1:12, "Then the Angel of the LORD answered and said, 'O LORD of hosts, how long will You not have mercy on Jerusalem and on the cities of Judah, against which You were angry these seventy years?"

Zech. 1:13, "And the LORD answered the angel who talked to me, with good and comforting words.
