

What the Bible Teaches About the Holy Spirit in the Old Testament

Zech. 4:6b, "'Not by might nor by power, but by My Spirit,' says the LORD of hosts."










God's Plan is to make it clear that the victory is His, not Gideon's, not the Israelites, but God alone gave the victory.

Judg. 7:2, "And the LORD said to Gideon, 'The people who are with you are too many for Me to give the Midianites into their hands, lest Israel claim glory for itself against Me, saying, "My own hand has saved me." '"

Midian had 135,000 soldiers. Gideon had 32,000.

Gideon was outnumbered over 4 to 1, but God thought Gideon had too many.

So they are reduced to 10,000.

BUT 13.5 to 1; still too many.

So they are reduced to 10,000.

BUT 13.5 to 1; still too many.

Then they will be reduced to 300. 450 to 1, those are now odds in God's favor.

1. God gives the analysis: If Israel wins with 4 to 1 odds against them, they can claim a tremendous victory and take all of the credit. "My own hand has saved me."



1. Fear is the opposite of trust in God; it is also contrasted with love.

1 John 4:18, "There is no fear in love; but complete (mature) love casts out fear, because fear involves punishment. But he who fears has not been made mature in love."

2. When we are operating on fear, we are no longer trusting God, and therefore cannot walk by faith.

3. Fear looks at a problem, a threat, a danger and sees no solution.

Faith looks at the problem in terms of the love, protection, omnipotence, and faithfulness of God.

4. Fear seems to be the basic orientation of fallen man.

Gen. 3:9, "Then the LORD God called to Adam and said to him, 'Where are you?'
Gen. 3:10, "So he said, 'I heard Your voice in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked; and I hid myself.'"

5. Fear is an emotional sin that attempts to overpower rationality. When it is not stifled by faith it leads to panic and an inability to think calmly. Fear destroys inner peace, stability, and tranquility.

Fear makes decisions from a position of weakness; faith from a position of strength.

6. Fear believes only we can solve our problems and we cannot solve the problems we face.

The Function of Fear

1. The more things you fear, the more things you will surrender to fear.

2. The extent to which you surrender to fear, the greater your capacity for fear.

3. The greater your capacity for fear, the more you increase the power of fear in your life.

4. The more you increase the power of fear in your life, the greater your failure to execute the unique spiritual life of the Church Age.

5. Fear replaces a God focus with a creature focus as the focus of life. Then we try to resolve the fear through anything that will distract us: drugs, alcohol, entertainment, sports, anything can be used to cloak fear and avoid dealing with it.

6. A soldier that cannot exercise self-control in a dangerous situation relies on emotion and becomes a danger to all.

7. God's solution to fear is orientation to grace, orientation to God's plan and purposes, orientation to what the Bible teaches.

Psa. 34:4, "I sought the LORD, and He heard me, and delivered me from all my fears."

Isa. 41:10, "Fear not for I am with you; be not dismayed for I am your God. I will strengthen you; I will help you; yes, I will hold you up with the right hand of My Righteousness."

2 Tim. 1:7, "For God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power and reciprocal love and sound judgment."

Psa. 31:24, "Be of good courage, and He shall strengthen your heart, all you who hope in the LORD."

Psa. 27:14, "Wait on the LORD; Be of good courage, and He shall strengthen your heart; Wait, I say, on the LORD!"

<u>Deut. 31:6</u>, "Be strong and of good courage, do not fear nor be afraid of them; for the LORD your God, He is the One who goes with you. He will not leave you nor forsake you."

<u>Deut. 31:8</u>, "And the LORD, He is the One who goes before you. He will be with you, He will not leave you nor forsake you; do not fear nor be dismayed."
