




**Judg. 11:27**, “ ‘Therefore I have not sinned against you, but you wronged me by fighting against me. May the Lord, the Judge, render judgment this day between the children of Israel and the people of Ammon.’ ” ~NKJV

**Ex. 31:5**, “in cutting jewels for setting, in carving wood, and to work in all manner of workmanship.

**Ex. 31:6**, “And I, indeed I, have appointed with him **Aholiab** the son of Ahisamach, of the tribe of Dan; and I have put wisdom in the hearts of all the gifted artisans, that they may make all that I have commanded you:”

עַלְהָ *olah* comm fem sing abs

HALOT “sacrifice which is wholly burned, comprising domestic animals and occasionally birds”

DCH “burnt offering, i.e., sacrifice entirely consumed by fire, offered daily morning and evening”

BDB “n.f. (noun, feminine) whole burnt-offering (that which goes up (✓ 6) to heaven (al. on altar))

**Gen. 28:20**, “Then Jacob vowed a vow, saying, ‘If God will  
be with me, and keep me in this way that I am going, and  
give me bread to eat and clothing to put on,

**Gen. 28:21**, “ ‘so that I come back to my father’s house in  
peace, then the LORD shall be my God.

**Gen. 28:22**, “ ‘And this stone which I have set as a pillar  
shall be God’s house, and of all that You give me I will  
surely give a tenth to You.’ ”

**Num. 21:2, “So Israel made a vow to the LORD, and said, ‘If You will indeed deliver this people into my hand, then I will utterly destroy their cities.’ ”**

**1 Sam. 1:11**, “Then she made a vow and said, ‘O LORD of hosts, if You will indeed look on the affliction of Your maidservant and remember me, and not forget Your maidservant, but will give Your maidservant a male child, then I will give him to the LORD all the days of his life, and no razor shall come upon his head.’ ”

**2 Sam. 15:7, “Now it came to pass after forty years that Absalom said to the king, ‘Please, let me go to Hebron and pay the vow which I made to the LORD.**

**2 Sam. 15:8, “ ‘For your servant took a vow while I dwelt at Geshur in Syria, saying, “If the LORD indeed brings me back to Jerusalem, then I will serve the LORD.” ” ”**

## Evidence of child sacrifice

**Deut. 12:31, “You shall not worship the LORD your God in that way; for every abomination to the LORD which He hates they have done to their gods; for they burn even their sons and daughters in the fire to their gods.”**

**Deut. 18:10, “There shall not be found among you anyone who makes his son or his daughter pass through the fire, or one who practices witchcraft, or a soothsayer, or one who interprets omens, or a sorcerer,”**

## Evidence of child sacrifice

**2 Kings 3:26**, “And when the king of Moab saw that the battle was too fierce for him, he took with him seven hundred men who drew swords, to break through to the king of Edom, but they could not.

**2 Kings 3:27**, “Then he took his eldest son who would have reigned in his place, and offered him as a burnt offering upon the wall; and there was great indignation against Israel. So they departed from him and returned to their own land.”

# Evidence from Carthage

“To our lady, to Tanit, the face of Baal, and to our lord, to Baal-hamon that which was vowed by [A], son of [B], son of [C], because he [that is, the deity] heard [A’s] voice and blessed him.”

**“The clause ‘whatever comes out of the doors of my house to meet me’ envisages the exuberant welcome by children of a father who has been away on a military campaign. For the moment the reader does not know that Jephthah has only one child, that in putting her at risk he also jeopardizes himself, and that, ironically, in securing his own victory he sentences his lineage to death.”**
