
Philippians Series Lesson #059 December 28, 2023

Review/Overview

Paul has challenged the Philippians to quit being selfabsorbed, pursuing their own agendas, and to pursue Christ.



8. Timothy and Silas eventually joined Paul in Corinth (Acts 18:5).

9. He next appears with Paul in Ephesus on his third journey (Acts 19:22), from where Paul sends Erastus and him into Macedonia ahead of himself.

- "Brother" (2 Cor. 1:1; Col. 1:1; 1 Thess. 3:2)
- "Bond-servant" (Php. 1:1)
- "Beloved and faithful child in the Lord" (1 Cor. 4:17)
- "Son" (1 Tim. 1:2; 2 Tim. 1:2)
- Coequal in the Lord's work (1 Cor. 16:10; 1 Thess. 3:2)
