Preliminary Observations

- ✓ Dispensationalism represents biblical teaching taken at <u>face value</u>
- ✓ Most features of dispensationalism can be found in the <u>early church</u>
- ✓ Modern dispensationalism represents a rediscovery of the <u>Jewish perspective</u> of the Bible

UNITY IN GOD'S OVERALL MULTI-FACETED PLAN

Positives about this definition...

- ➤ It highlights where the movement gets its <u>name</u>
 - ✓ The term *dispensationalism* appears to first be used in the <u>1930s</u>
- The word <u>dispensation</u> is a biblical term
- It is the <u>popular understanding</u> of the term

In popular understanding...

Dispensationalism is a system of biblical interpretation popular with Protestant evangelicals and fundamentalists. Dispensationalists divide biblical history into different periods, called dispensations, in which God covenanted with humanity in particular ways.

Positives about this definition...

- Many dispensational teachers appear to view it this way
 - ✓ John Hannah
 - ✓ John Walvoord "Dispensationalism is an approach to the Bible that recognizes differing moral responsibilities for people, in keeping with how much they knew about God and His ways." (BibSac 2001)

Dispensationalism as belief in dispensations



Everyone is a dispensationalist!

Remove the divisive "D-word" from the debate

Focus on two issues:

- 1. Literal hermeneutics
- 2. Distinction between Israel and the Church

Problems with this definition...

- It may not fully do justice to the modern history of dispensationalism
- Every covenant theologian since John Calvin has believed in dispensations making the simple approach of saying dispensationalism = belief in dispensations an inadequate definition

Dispensationalism as an Israeli-flavored view of history

Positives with this definition...

- It honors Israel's central role in the timeline of biblical history
- Dispensationalism does have a unique philosophy of history

Problems with this definition...

- > It only gives a partial view of the central features of dispensationalism
- ➤ It could give the wrong impression that dispensationalism views the Church as God's <u>secondary "Plan B"</u>

Dispensationalism as a descriptive list of abiding concerns

Some notes on this approach...

- This is the way that many <u>progressive</u> dispensationalists define dispensationalism
- It is the idea that there is no sine qua non, no essentials, just a loosely bound list of concerns that mark off the historical movement of dispensationalism

What makes the list of abiding concerns?

- > Authority of Scripture
- Dispensations
- Uniqueness of the Church
- Practical significance of the Universal Church

- Significance of biblical prophecy
- Futurist premillennialism
- > A national future for <u>Israel</u>

Positives with this definition...

- The list of abiding concerns contains valid beliefs held by dispensationalists
- This view has <u>flexibility</u> which allows for <u>anomalies</u> within the history of dispensationalism

Problems with this definition...

- Following this approach could I ever define "orthodox Christianity"?
- ➤ Historically there seems to be a substantial set of core beliefs held by the dispensational tradition

Dispensationalism as belief in the future of national Israel

Positives with this definition...

This definition goes to the heart of one of the major beliefs of dispensationalism

> It clearly rejects replacement theology in its very definition

Problems with this definition...

- ➤ Many Christian Zionists exist who have no connection to dispensationalism how do we handle the differences?
- This approach is both too broad and too narrow at certain points
- Dispensationalism is more <u>robust</u> and <u>detailed</u> in its history

Which "literal" interpretation?

Literal interpretation at the level of an expression



Opposite is figurative

Literal interpretation as grammatical-historical interpretation



Opposite is allegory



By "consistent" literal interpretation Ryrie meant that we interpret prophecy literally (grammaticalhistorical) just like the rest of the Bible.



Literal interpretation has always been a marked feature of Premillennialism; in Dispensationalism it has been carried to an extreme. We have seen that this literalism found its most thoroughgoing expression in the claim that Israel must mean Israel, and that the Church was a mystery, unknown to the prophets and first made known to the apostle Paul.


Now if the principle of interpretation is adopted that Israel always means Israel, that it does not mean the Church, then it follows of necessity that practically all of our information regarding the millennium will concern a Jewish or Israelitish age.

- ➤ It describes the modern historical movement of dispensationalism with a measure of precision
