1. The *writer* of Hebrews is **UNKNOWN**, though ultimately it was the **HOLY SPIRIT**.



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1. The *writer* of Hebrews is UNKNOWN, though ultimately it was the HOLY SPIRIT.

2. The *recipients* of Hebrews were **JEWISH BELIEVERS IN CHRIST**, not the **UNSAVED** (3:1;4:1; 6:1,9; 10:19, 39; 12:1; 13:22).

Hebrews 3:1 Therefore, holy brethren, partakers of the heavenly calling, consider the Apostle and High Priest of our confession, Christ Jesus,

1. The *writer* of Hebrews is UNKNOWN, though ultimately it was the HOLY SPIRIT.

2. The *recipients* of Hebrews were BELIEVERS IN CHRIST, not the UNSAVED.



5. The *problem* being addressed in Hebrews is centered on significant **PRESSURE & PERSECUTION** directed to these believers by the Jewish community and the imminent danger of their **RETURN to RABBINICAL JUDAISM.** (Hebrews 10:32-39; 13:7-14)



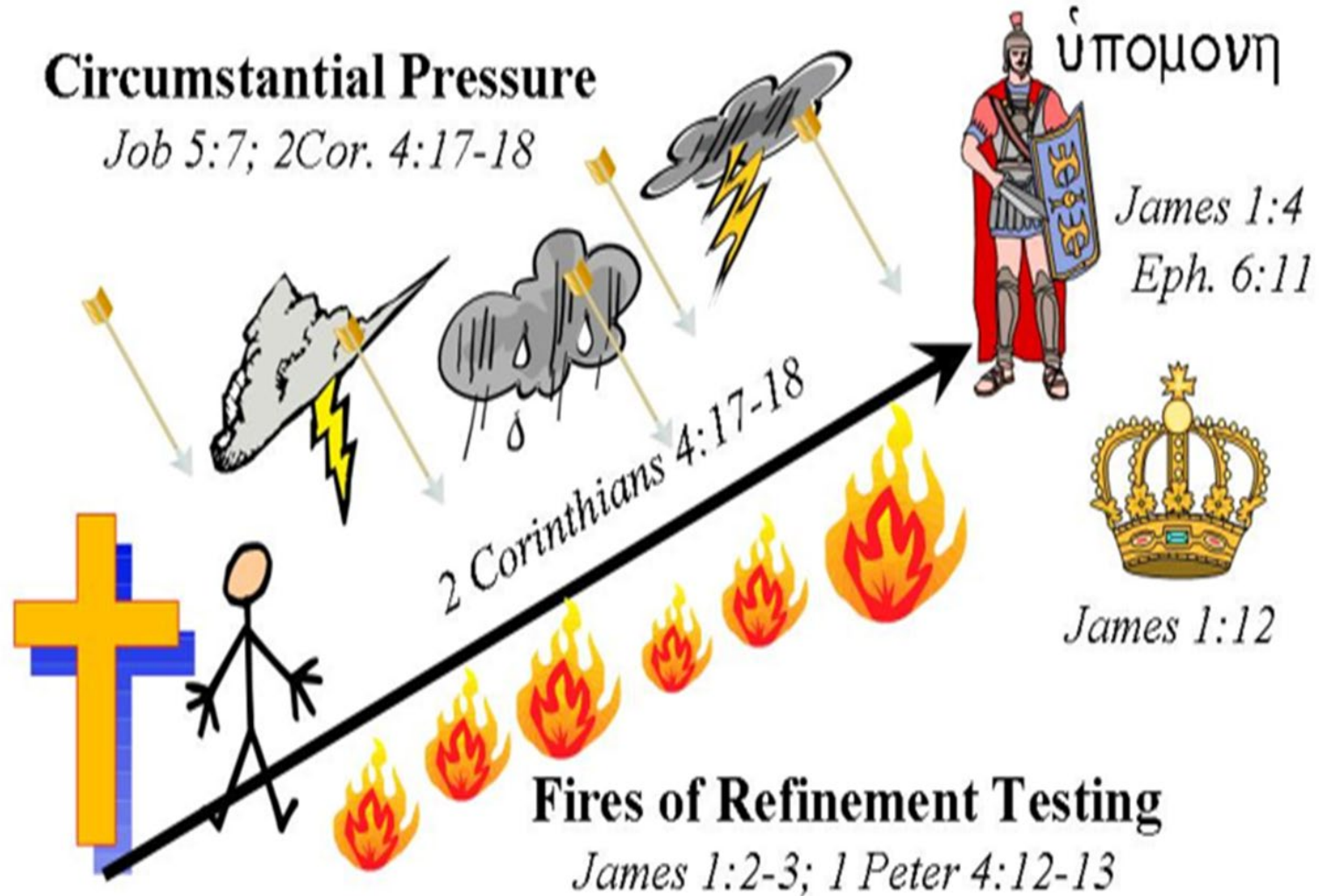

6. The *purpose* of Hebrews is to demonstrate the **SUPREMACY OF CHRIST** so as to challenge believers to **WALK BY FAITH** and **PERSEVERE** in the face of tremendous pressure to compromise resulting in conditional blessings in time and reward later.

7. The contrast that is emphasized is the **FAILURE** of the Exodus generation of believers (Hebrews 3) to walk by faith and enter into God's rest (Hebrews 3) and the offer of **FAITH –REST LIFE** to these Hebrew Christians years later (Hebrews 4).

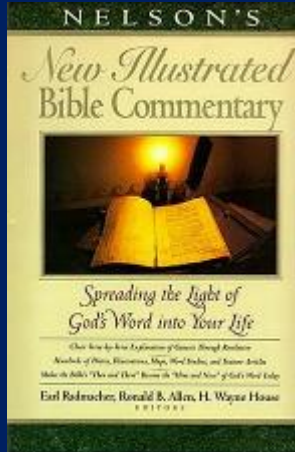

a. The *subject* of this third warning revolves around the concept of REST.

b. The *meaning* of “rest” involves...CESSATION OF WORK OR LABOR; FREEDOM FROM WORRIES OR ANXIETIES; SENSE OF CONFIDENCE, PEACE, AND INNER STABILITY INVOLVING DEPENDENCE UPON SOMEONE OR SOMETHING.

- **What is this ‘rest’ referring to in this context?**

1) It is not **SALVATION**. {Due to context; they were already believers; also 1 John 5:13; and 2 Tim. 2:13 }

2) It is not **HEAVEN**. {Due to context, and a correct understanding of Canaan land. }

3) It is not the **MILLENNIUM**. {Due to context & that entrance is being offered now, not later. }

4) It is the daily **FAITH-REST LIFE** in which the believer walks by faith in dependence upon God and enjoys inner peace, joy, stability, etc. as the Lord fights His battles and carries His burdens. This is supported by the fact that it is being presently offered to them to be entered today, without waiting for some future time & was available to the Exodus generation, thus nullifying Heaven & the Millennium.

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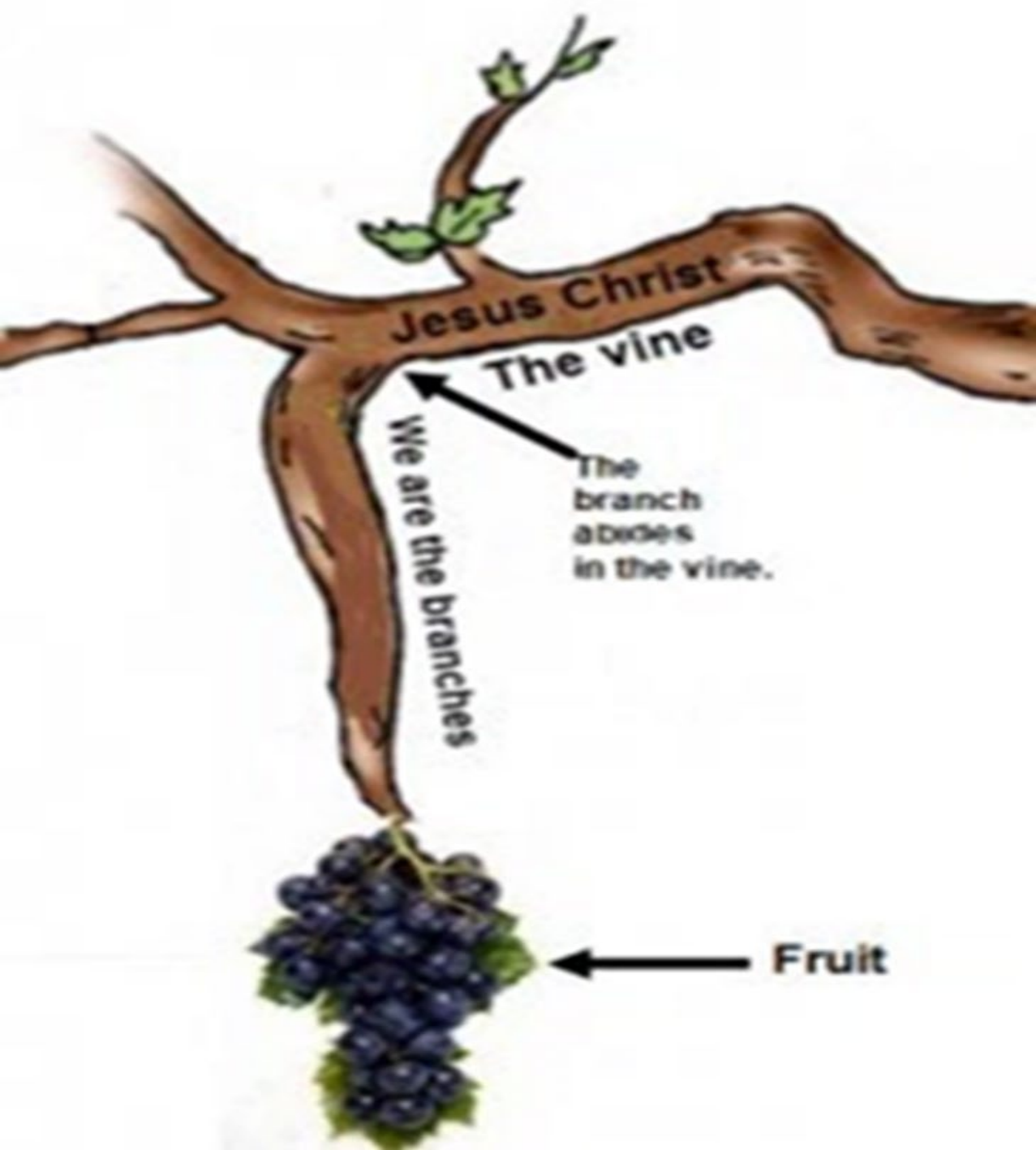

- **Why is this important to remember?**

Because just like with our justification before God or positional sanctification, this daily rest and practical sanctification cannot be pumped out or produced by our self-efforts and living by law. We must enter by faith in the Lord.

GRACE
We Just Don't Get It



Legalism is the mental attitude which seeks to earn or merit the blessings of God by religious rituals or good works for either salvation or sanctification.

Years ago, Miles Stanford insightfully penned, *“Our Father knows that we are weakness incarnate; that we can do nothing. The trouble is that we do not know it. He must bring us all to the place where we see that we are utterly weak and helpless.”* Is not this what Paul declared?

2 Corinthians 3:5 Not that we are sufficient of ourselves to think of anything as being from ourselves, but our sufficiency is from God,

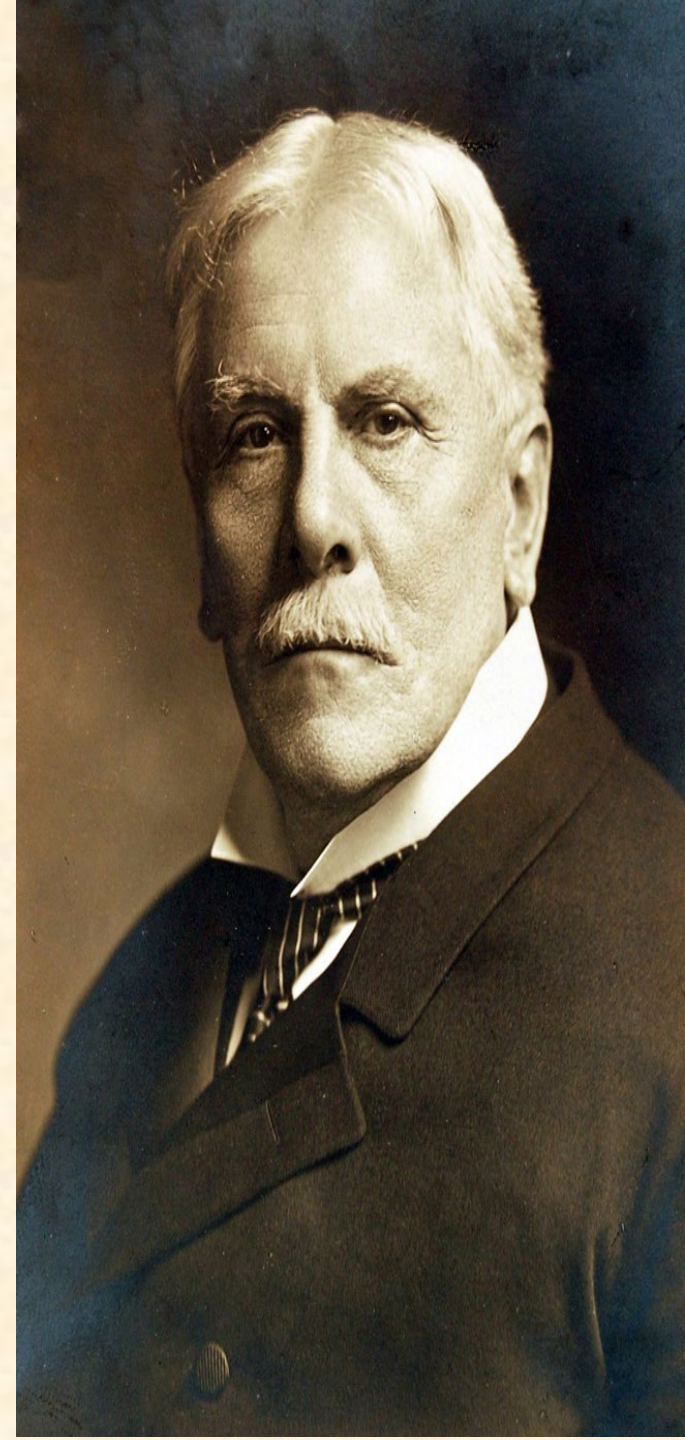
2 Corinthians 12:9-10 And He said to me, “My grace is sufficient for you, for My strength is made perfect in weakness.” Therefore most gladly I will rather boast in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me. 10 Therefore I take pleasure in infirmities, in reproaches, in needs, in persecutions, in distresses, for Christ’s sake. For when I am weak, then I am strong.

Colossians 2:6-7

As you have therefore received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in Him, 7 rooted and built up in Him and established in the faith, as you have been taught, abounding in it with thanksgiving.

- *Do your best for Jesus.* But is that how you received Jesus Christ?
- *Confess your sins.* But is that what Acts 16:31 states?
- *Wake up and get to work.* What a contrast to Ephesians 2:8-9!
- *Obedience is the key.* Is that what John 3:16 states?
- *Practice the spiritual disciplines.* Romans 4:4-5 destroys that form of legalism.

C.I. Scofield wisely wrote years ago about Paul in Romans 7: *It is a very common mistake to suppose that we could be holy if we wanted to. We think our difficulty lies in bringing the will to act on the side of what God requires, and that if we only put forth sufficient will-power we should enter upon a spiritual life. But here is a man who makes the amazing discovery that the spiritual life is something above the reach of his will at its highest stretch. He cannot grasp spirituality and bring it down into his life by willing to do it. And this was the experience, let us remember, of one of the strongest wills that ever was lodged in a human character. The Apostle Paul was not a weakling; he was endowed with immense will power. (New Life in Christ, p. 18)*

5. The *ongoing promise and possibility of entering God’s rest* REMAINS for you. (4:1a)
- 6. The *good news of God’s rest* is a message God had and still wants PREACHED to believers in the PRESENT just as in the PAST. (4:2a)**

Hebrews 4:2 For indeed the gospel {of the faith-rest life} was preached to us {1st century Christians} as well as to them {Exodus generation} ; but the word which they {the Exodus generation} heard did not profit them, {why?} not being mixed with faith in those who heard it.

7. The *means of entering God's rest* involves more than HEARING / KNOWING God's Word [as important as that is], but also BELIEVING in God's PERSON, PROMISES and PRINCIPLES. (4:2b; 5:12-14)

Hebrews 4:2 For indeed the gospel [of God's rest] was preached to us as well as to them; but the word which they heard did not profit them, not being mixed with faith in those who heard it.

• **Why don't many believers enter or enjoy God's rest today?**

1. **IGNORANCE** ... of knowing the availability of God's rest or how to enter it.

2. **ARROGANCE** ... in thinking they can handle life by their own wisdom and/or strength, or that they must help God out.

3. **APATHY** ... about spiritual realities as they pursue the pleasures of sin or the world to their own sp. ruin.

4. **REBELLION** ... in resisting or violating God's will for them.

5. **SELF-CENTEREDNESS** ... as they think life is about their fulfillment instead of fulfilling God's will.

8. The *faith-rest life* is a **TRANSDISPENSATIONAL** principle over the ages as illustrated in **CREATION** and **CANAAN**. (4:3-5)



9. The *present opportunity to enter God's rest* still **REMAINS available to **ALL** believers **TODAY**, though it is only entered by **SOME**. (4:6-9)**

Hebrews 4:6-9 Since therefore it **remains** that **some** must enter it, and those to whom it was first preached **did not enter** because of disobedience {unbelief}, 7 again He designates a certain day, saying in David, "**Today**," after such a long time, as it has been said: "**Today**, if you will hear His voice, Do not harden your hearts." 8 For if Joshua had given them rest, then He would not afterward have spoken of another day. 9 **There remains therefore a rest for the people of God.**

This emphasizes that the Christian life is a moment by moment, daily walk of faith that can be entered into and enjoyed at any time if we are willing to turn in faith to the Lord.

10. The *necessities* for entering God's rest include God's GRACE provisions. (4:10) and your FAITH in God's person, principles and promises, as it involves a willingness for you to CEASE FROM YOUR OWN WORKS as God did from His. (4:10)

Hebrews 4:10 For he who has entered His rest has himself also ceased from his works as God did from His.

Matthew 6:30 "Now if God so clothes the grass of the field, which today is, and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will He not much more clothe you, *O you of little faith?*

Matthew 8:8-10 The centurion answered and said, "Lord, I am not worthy that You should come under my roof. But only speak a word, and my servant will be healed. 9 "For I also am a man under authority, having soldiers under me. And I say to this one, 'Go,' and he goes; and to another, 'Come,' and he comes; and to my servant, 'Do this,' and he does it." 10 When Jesus heard it, He marveled, and said to those who followed, "Assuredly, I say to you, *I have not found such great faith, not even in Israel!*

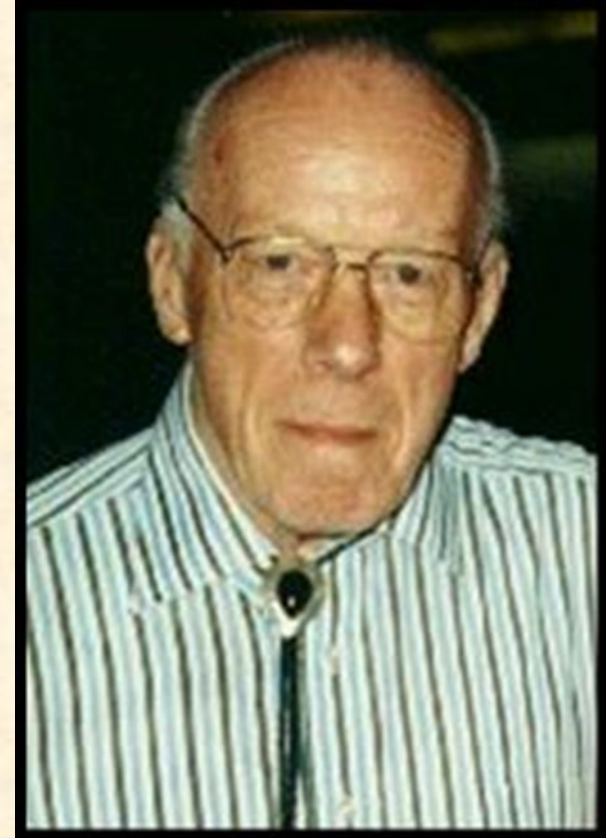

* The Christian life is one of active dependence and passive production. (DR)



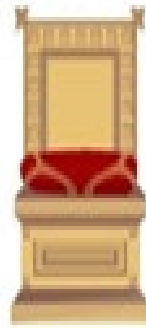

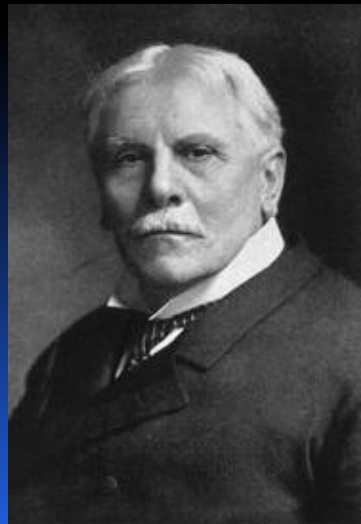
What new elements does faith-resting in Christ involve in this present dispensation of grace?

5) It involves “rightly dividing the word of truth” with a **HEAVENLY/GRACE** orientation as a **CITIZEN** of Heaven (Phil. 3:20) and member of the **CHURCH, THE BODY OF CHRIST** (Eph. 2 & 3) who has been blessed with **ALL** spiritual blessings in the heavenly places in Christ (Eph. 1:3; Col. 2:10) with a **HEAVENLY** destiny and home (John 14:1-3) and heavenly **INHERITANCE** (1 Peter 1:3-5) so that we see ourselves as **PILGRIMS** on the Earth (1 Pet. 2:11) and **AMBASSADORS** for Christ (2 Cor. 5:18-21).

It may safely be said that the Judaizing of the church has done more to hinder her progress, pervert her mission, and destroy her spiritually than all other causes combined.

C.I. SCOFIELD from RIGHTLY DIVING THE WORD OF TRUTH

Instead of pursuing her appointed path of separation from the world and following the Lord in her heavenly calling, she has used Jewish Scriptures to justify herself in lowering her purpose to the civilization of the world, the acquisition of wealth, the use of an imposing ritual, the erection of magnificent churches, the invocation of God's blessing upon the conflicts of armies, and the division of an equal brotherhood into "clergy" and "laity."



11. The *factors* for entering God's rest include:

- c. DAILY DILIGENCE to enter God's rest. (4:11)
- d. The KNOWLEDGE of God's Word. (4:12)**

Hebrews 4:12 For the word of God is living and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the division of soul and spirit, and of joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart.

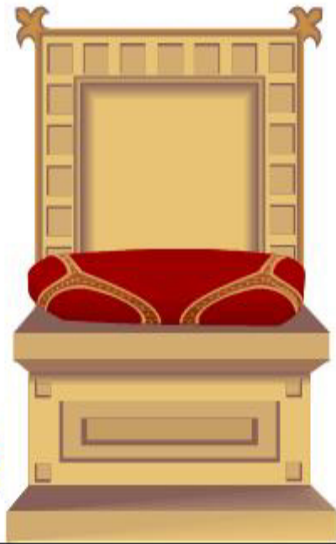

What about 1 John 1:9 and the confession of sin?

- 1) It is a transdispensational principle. (Prov. 28:13; 1 John 1:9)
- 2) 1 John 1:9 has a corrective place for being restored to having fellowship with God (1 John 1:7,9) but does not prevent sin in the believer's life. (Rom. 6-8)
- 3) While this passage { 1 John 1 } is an important section dealing with fellowship with God, yet in the book of 1 John itself, confession of sins is not again emphasized as the key to spirituality, though “abide” in some form is found
- 4) In the most extensive section on sanctification & spirituality in the NT (Rom. 6-8), confession of sins is totally absent and missing.

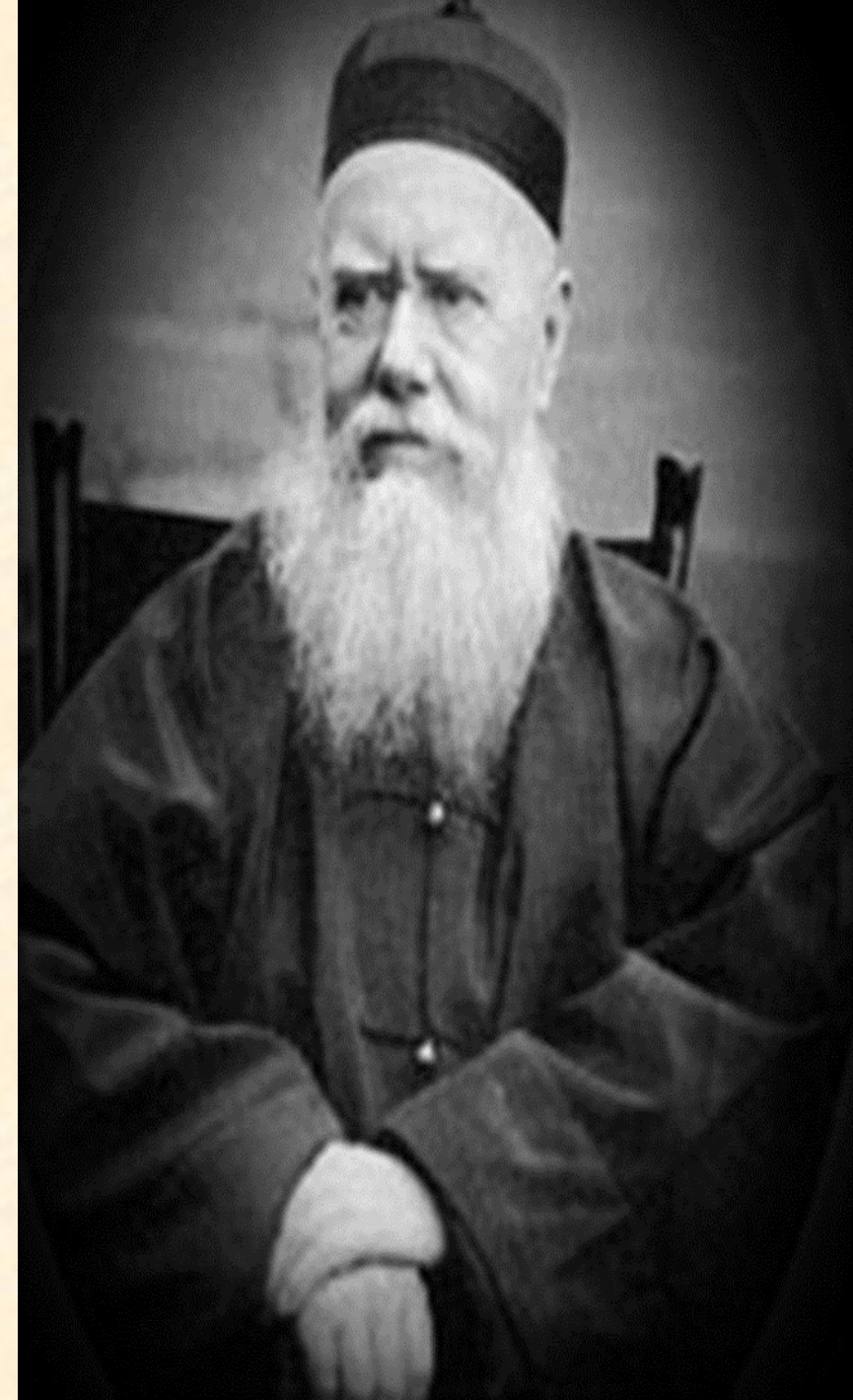
12. The *closing exhortations* regarding the faith-rest life amidst the pressure & persecution these believers were facing (Heb. 4:14-16):

Hebrews 4:14 Seeing then that we have a great High Priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, **let us hold fast our confession.** 15 For we do not have a High Priest who cannot sympathize with our weaknesses, but was in all points tempted as we are, yet without sin.

I knew that if only I could abide in Christ all would be well, but I could not. I would begin the day with prayer, determined not to take my eye off Him for a moment, but pressure of duties, sometimes very trying, and constant interruptions apt to be so wearing, caused me to forget Him. Then one's nerves get so fretted in this climate that temptations to irritability, had thoughts and sometimes unkind words are all the more difficult to control. Each day brought its register of sin and failure, of lack of power. To will was indeed "present with me," but how to perform I found not.



All the time I felt assured that there was in Christ all I needed, but the practical question was—how to get it out. He was rich truly, but I was poor; He was strong, but I weak. I knew full well that there was in the root, the stem, abundant fatness, but how to get it into my puny little branch was the question. As gradually light dawned, I saw that faith was the only requisite—was the hand to lay hold on His fullness and make it mine. But I had not this faith.

I strove for faith, but it would not come; I tried to exercise it, but in vain. Seeing more and more the wondrous supply of grace laid up in Jesus, the fullness of our precious Savior, my guilt and helplessness seemed to increase. Sins committed appeared but as trifles compared with the sin of unbelief which was their cause, which could not or would not take God at His word. . . . I prayed for faith, but it came not. What was I to do?

When my agony of soul was at its height, a sentence in a letter from dear McCarthy was used to remove the scales from my eyes, and the Spirit of God revealed to me the truth of our oneness with Jesus as I had never known it before.

"But how to get faith strengthened? Not by striving after faith, but by resting on the Faithful One." "But how to get faith strengthened? Not by striving after faith, but by resting on the Faithful One." "Ah, there is rest!" I thought. "I have striven in vain to rest in Him. I'll strive no more. For has not He promised to abide with me—never to leave me, never to fail me?" And, . . . He never will.
